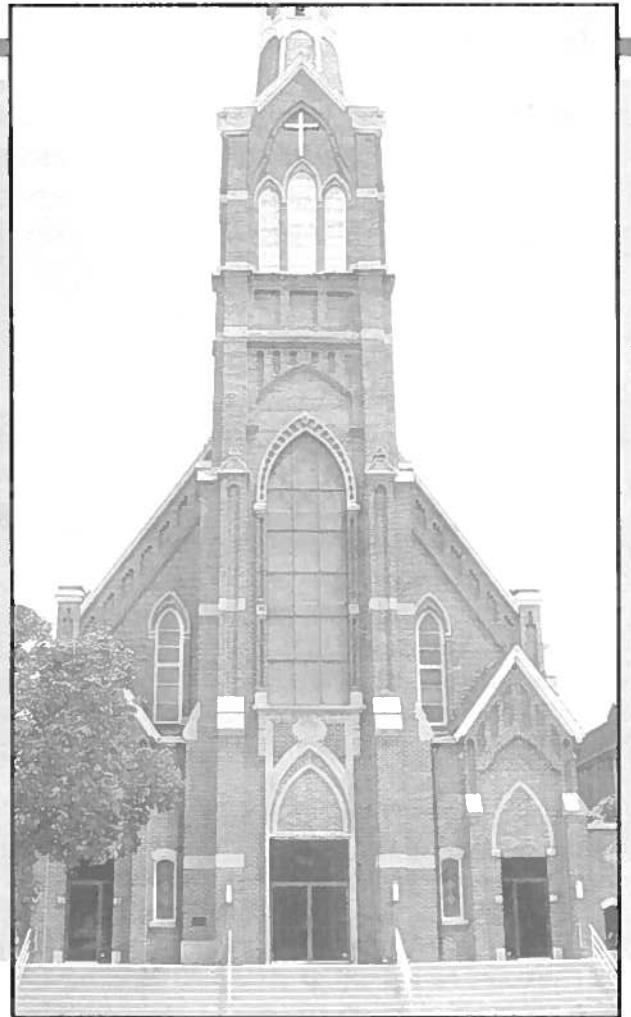
**RECONCILIATION** Saturday at 3:30 p.m. and by appointment.

Dear Parishioners:

The old adage “you are what you eat” comes to mind reflecting on the Bread of Life readings. When we eat a number of foods, like garlic, its aroma can be detected emanating from us. **Today we have the climax. John 6 is about sustenance.** It is about eating. It is about nourishment. It is about the Eucharist. It is not about eating like we normally eat. Normally, when we eat, we assimilate the food. Yes, our body breaks down the food and takes the nutrients it needs, feeding our cells. In a sense, the food becomes part of us. We assimilate the food. But that is not what happens when we receive the Eucharist.

When we receive the Eucharist, instead of us assimilating the food, the food assimilates us. **When we receive the Eucharist, Jesus transforms us.** We take on the life of the Lord. We heard in the Gospel: “Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me.”

The first reading speaks about the Wisdom of God. **God has built a house and invited us to a dinner. “Come and eat and drink and live forever,”** He says. He gives us the dream of living in peace and happiness totally united to Him for all eternity.

In unity we are called to work to believe so we may remain in Christ and He in us! As we receive Him in this Eucharist, let us pray to be strengthened by this “food and drink” so we may “forsake foolishness” and live forever!

**FROM THE SCHOOL**

Miss Lucas and I attended the annual Preschool and Extended Day Institute last week at Sylvania St. Joseph (east campus). The diocese hosts it each year. Our morning speaker was Charlotte Perlaky from Lourdes University who spoke about behavior management and gave us some background into the "Flip It" Strategy. She had four objectives in her talk: Describe the importance of establishing classroom rules; identify different strategies for teaching and reinforcing rules; understand guidelines for effectually developing and displaying rules; and establish the importance of communication with families.

Her "flip it" strategy was about the need to understand emotions of the children; their feelings, limits, inquiries, and prompts. Feelings mean talk with the child, don't guess their feelings. Limits referred to unspoken rules such as, "What can you do to make them feel better?"

Inquiries meant encouraging the child to think about solutions and taking the time to figure out what the rage cycle is about. Prompts are creative cues such as, "What should we do next time?"

The speaker talked about understanding behavior expectations, life skills, and rules. They included: be safe; be responsible; and be respectful. These rules are different in the classroom from the hallway and playground. Classroom rules should cover the following: positively stated, simple & specific, few in number, and measurable & observable.

On the second day Elisa and Chuck Hage did a curriculum workshop called "Just Kiddin' Around" which showed how to use movement and/or music to enhance daily activities. One of the objectives was to allow teachers to feel creative educating with music and having FUN with the children.
