Dear Parishioners:

Today's Gospel and Psalm give us the flip side of the First Reading. In both, we hear of Jesus' sufferings from His point of view. Though His enemies surround Him, He offers himself freely in sacrifice, trusting that God will sustain Him.

But the apostles today don't understand this second announcement of Christ's passion. They begin arguing over issues of succession—over whom among them is greatest; who will be chosen to lead after Christ is killed.

Again they are thinking not as God, but as human beings. So Jesus teaches the Twelve—the chosen leaders of His Church—that they must lead by imitating His example of love and self-sacrifice again. This is reflected in the Letter of James from our second reading; we must seek wisdom from above, desiring humility, not glory, and in all things be gentle and full of mercy. Disciples must be “servants of all,” especially the weak and the helpless—symbolized by the child He embraces and places in their midst.

This is a lesson for us, too. We must have the mind of Christ, who humbled himself to come among us (see Philippians 2:5–11). We must freely offer ourselves; making everything we do a sacrifice in praise of His name.

We are challenged to look at our lives and reflect on how we offer service to God through serving others? We are also asked to discover how we can be of greater service to God and the people we encounter.

Thanks again to everyone who worked to make Turtle Fest a success! Thanks also to Mark & Amy Morman for providing the leadership again this year. We are still looking for someone to Chair Turtle Fest 2019 – is that person or couple you?

FROM THE SCHOOL

This is a continuation of the article on converting stress into usefulness from last week. Discover and develop your personality by honing four more skills.

Identify your strengths and weaknesses. Scripture says, "All fulfillment has its limits" (Psalm 119:96). Don't waste energy by pining to be something other than what you are. Who you are and the talents you possess are a gift from God, and God does not make mistakes! Support others whose skills, interests, and accomplishments are different from yours, and devote your energy to developing your strengths and compensating for what you perceive to be weaknesses. Foolish people miss out on their infinite potential by obsessing over the gifts of others.

Build conversational skills. Know what interests your audience. Learn about those topics, or at least create a few sentence starters about those topics as well as general conversation starters.

Treat people as expressions of God. All persons are precious gifts of God, made in God's own image-image Dei. People are not objects to be used, misused, abused, or discarded.

Learn to name your emotions. Give a specific title to your feelings. Only then will you be able to understand why you feel badly and be able to handle emotions in a healthy way.
