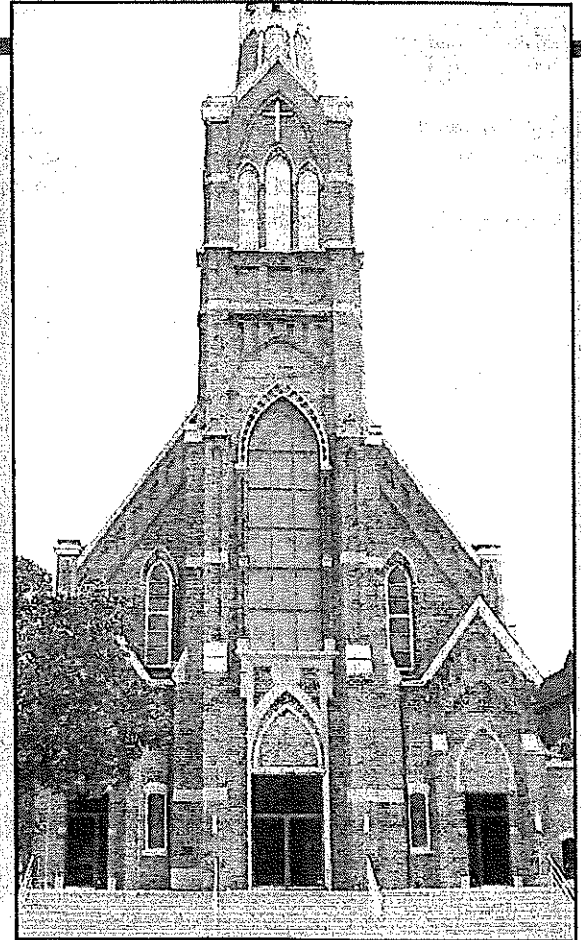
**RECONCILIATION** Saturday at 3:30 p.m. and by appointment.

Dear Parishioners:

Our Gospel today points to something bigger - **the problems of pain and suffering**. Isaiah writing about the "servant of the Lord" says, "The Lord was pleased to crush him..." Jesus fulfilling that prophecy speaks about his coming "baptism" - the humiliation and agony he would endure.

**What sense can we make of suffering?** Non-believers can throw in our faces war violence and famine - the list could go on and on. And we do not need to look so far. You and I experience suffering that seems senseless - and we all know people who have suffered greatly. I am reminded of the last few weeks of my mother's life, it was awful and beautiful all at the same time.

It has been said that suffering is the currency of love. After speaking about his "baptism" **Jesus says that he did not come to be served but to serve. Service always involves some measure of suffering.** A servant does not do his own will by definition. It's great when two wills come together, but even when they join perfectly (as was the case with Jesus and his Father) the suffering can still be horrific. Suffering is the currency of love.

This does not mean we go around telling everyone how much we are suffering! "Let me take care of that for you." Let me tell you all about the difficulty - just in case you didn't see my suffering and dedication. Jesus says something about not letting your left hand know what your right hand is doing. **Our buildings will turn to dust, our nations will unravel, but every act of love - every suffering joined to Jesus - will shine forever.**

Suffering is the currency of love. That is why we don't consider the terminally ill person useless. If he or she joins their suffering to the cross, that love has countless value. **If you have good health, thank God for it and think of a quiet, unexpected service you can offer today.** Jesus says: "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many."

**FROM THE SCHOOL**

I found an article by St. Patricia Ann McCormick in the newsletter, Joy of Teaching.

It is commonly known that while at school the role of a teacher is "in loco parentis" (in place of a parent). In a Catholic school, it is accurate to say that the teacher is in loco Jesu- in the place of Jesus!

Most times a smile, a high-five, a fist-bump, a wink, a private joke, a thumbs-up, or a thoughtful, patient gesture is all it takes to be Jesus to someone. At other times it takes a moral miracle to deliver Jesus-like attitudes. Sometimes you will encounter student attitudes that practically scream, "I dare you to love me!" Take the dare, Jesus would.

Jesus demonstrated that love and like are not synonymous. You don't have to like a student or a student's behavior. Fortunately for us, Jesus did not command us to like each other. His one command was: "AS I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (John 13:34). Love is a choice; it's an act of will. Love decides to initiate conversation, include the marginalized, heal the broken, take advantage of teachable moments, offer do-overs, use humor to diffuse tension, give hope, and seek the welfare of another person even at the sacrificial price of personal convenience and preference.

Kids Heart Challenge (formerly called Jump Rope for Heart) was held recently on a Friday afternoon. Students were asked to raise money with prizes given for certain amounts donated. Online payments were accepted. The students and teachers planned to walk to Kids Kingdom, but it rained most of the day. They played in the gym, instead. 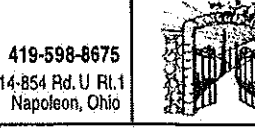
