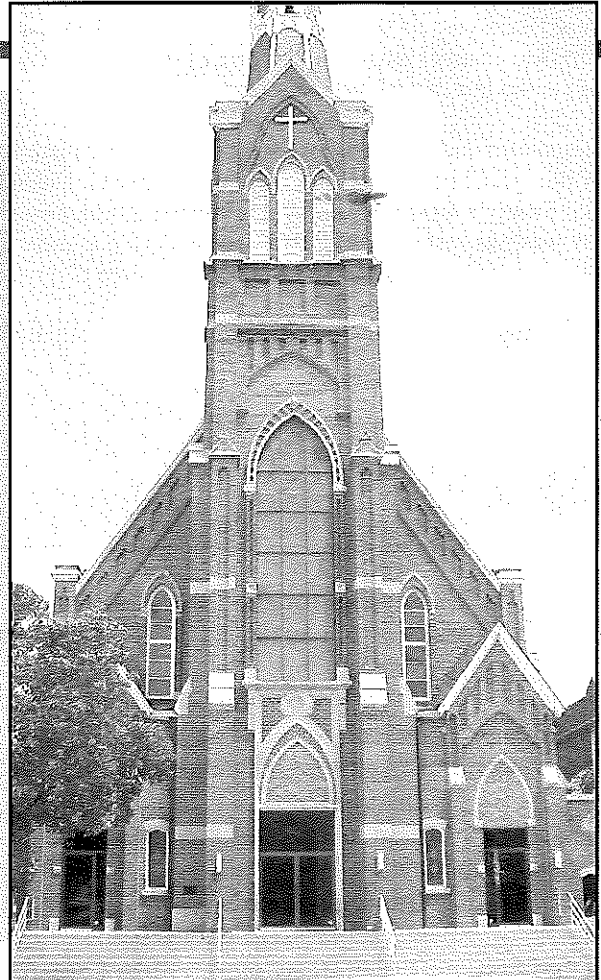

Dear Parishioners:

Today's Gospel is taken from what some call the most difficult chapter of Mark's Gospel (13:24-32) and is often interpreted as announcing the end of the world. Chapter 13 of Mark is often called the "little apocalypse." Like Daniel 7-12 and the Book of Revelation, it focuses on a world of persecution. **When we take the chapter as a whole, we will be able to see that we are dealing with the theme of meaning rather than chronology or time.**

Jesus' prediction of the destruction of the temple provoked questions that the four disciples put to Him in private regarding the time and the sign when all these things are about to come to an end (Mark 13:3-4). **We find in Mark's Gospel instruction and consolation encouraging the disciples and the Church to faith and obedience** through the trials that would confront them. **No one but the Father knows the precise time, or that of the end of the world** (Mark 13:32); hence the necessity of constant vigilance. Anyone who says they know the end of time should not be believed!

Mark's Gospel teaches us that all who follow Jesus will be put to the test. They will be tested by great affliction or by powerful seducers who do signs and wonders to lead them astray. They will be tested by the ordinary routines of daily existence and by physical desires. Whatever the form of the tests we face, **Mark tells us that we must remain vigilant and pray.** We shall be put to the test, but we need not fear.

It's important that we never lose sight of the bigger picture of salvation history as we face the setbacks, losses and tragedies of daily life. As Christians, we are invited each day to respond to the discussions of hope and gloom, which often have obsessed our world. **Today's Gospel in the end invites us to ask ourselves if we are satisfied with the quality of our love and service if today was our last in this world?** The apocalyptic message today could sound gloomy, but when we look more closely at the Good News we see that the Son of Man will come to rescue His people!

Have a Happy Thanksgiving and please remember the **9:00 Mass on Thanksgiving Day!**

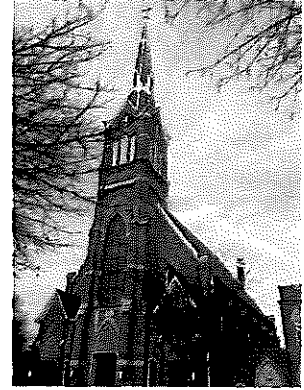


Dear Parishioners:
