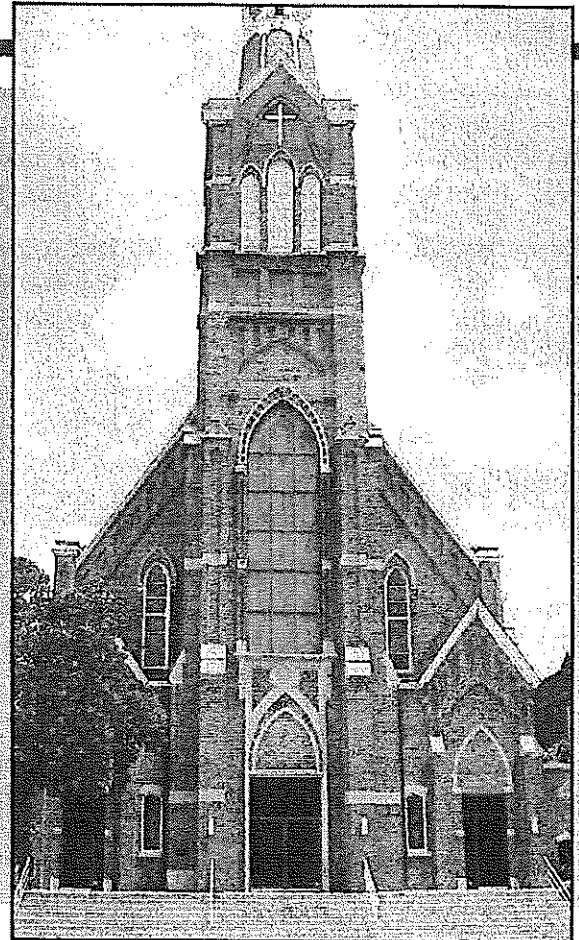

Dear Parishioners:

The liturgical year ends with the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In John's emotional trial scene of Pilate and Jesus, we see a great contrast between power and the lack of it. **Jesus' kingdom is contrasting the one that Pilate knows** and is willingly or unwillingly part of. Pilate's kingdom, and for that matter the Roman kingdom, was one of uncertainty, privileges, domination and occupation. **Jesus' kingdom is built on love, justice and peace.**

Jesus proclaims the kingdom of God, the kingdom of holiness and grace, of justice, love and peace. Jesus speaks of this kingdom as a future reality, but a reality that is mysteriously already present in Him, his actions and words and in his personal destiny. **Pope Benedict XVI said: "By calling ourselves Christians, we label ourselves as followers of the king... The law was to be Israel's king... God yielded to Israel's obstinacy and devised a new kind of kingship for them... The feast of Christ the King is therefore not a feast of those subjugated, but a feast of those who know that they are in the hands of the one who writes straight on crooked lines."**

The feast of Christ the King presents us with the image of Christ crowned – first with thorns, then with the victor's laurel branch. **On the day of our baptism, the crown of our head was smeared with the holy oil of chrism, that royal oil that makes us another Christ, another Anointed One. We have the power to live faithfully and love fiercely as Jesus did.** The crown of glory – Christ's very own – is promised to each of us.

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, our Crucified King hangs in our midst, arms outstretched in loving mercy and welcome. **May we have the courage to ask him to remember us in his kingdom, the grace to imitate him in our own earthly kingdoms, and the wisdom to welcome him when he stands knocking at the doors of our lives and hearts.**

FROM THE SCHOOL

Students in grades 7 & 8 were studying several different culture/empires in the B.C. era. They included the Hittites, Assyrians, Chaldeans, and Persians. One student reported Persian achievements:

- Built Ancient Persepolis which was a very architectural city
- Built (developed) a mail system
- Made the Royal Road
- Sold purple dye
- Invented their own alphabet

Rulers of the Persian Empire included Cyrus II, Darius I, and Xerxes.

Another student reported on the Assyrians. Their significant achievements included:

- Built iron weapons
- Good with the military; largest standing army
- Experts in creating canals
- First to utilize indoor plumbing
- First to have laws and library

Two rulers were King Shamshi-Adad who was one of the strongest leaders of the early empire and expanded their rule and wealth. Another ruler was King Tiglath-Pileser I who helped them conquer most of the Middle East. The Assyrians reached their peak when he was king.

Academic Fair started on November 5 for grades 5-8. Each grade is given a general topic (religion, art, history, and science). Mrs. Deniston and Miss Fields met with the group and handed out a letter for parents explaining the process and due dates for different sections. They mentioned that it can be stressful especially the judging and presenting in front of their peers. A research paper has been added back in this year under the guidance of Mrs. Krueger. That will take place after the judging. The first few weeks were spent finding a topic they liked and finding enough material, sources, and information to make a project out of it. This activity culminates in the judging in March.

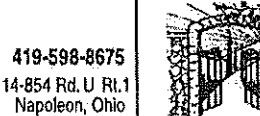
