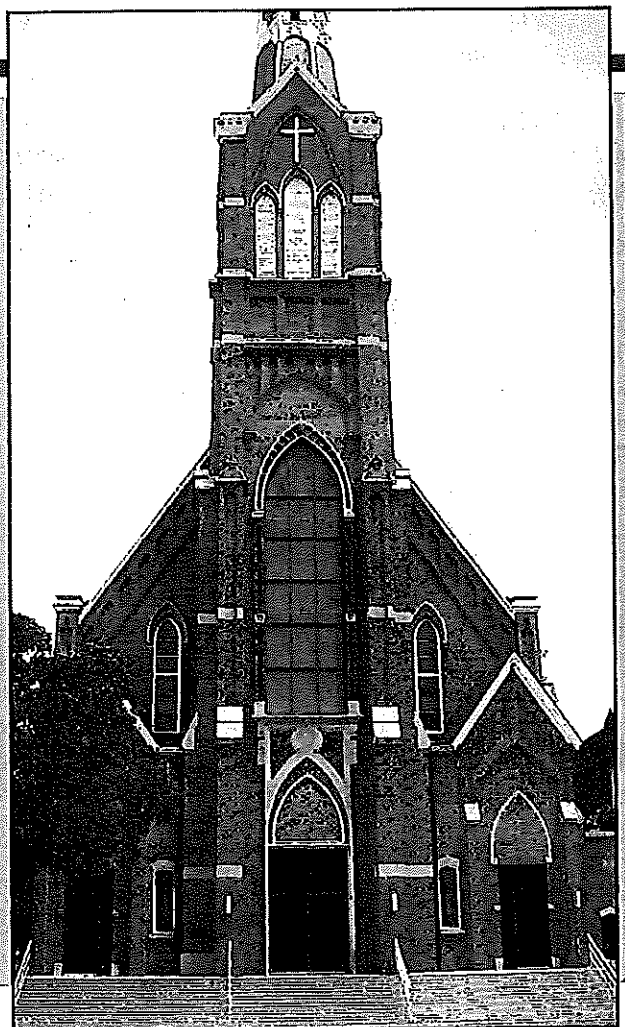

Dear Parishioners:

When we think of the "Magi" or "the Three Kings" it is easy to see that they began their journey because of a deep longing that moved them to leave everything behind and begin a journey. **The word Epiphany means manifestation and is connected with light shining in darkness.** The light of Jesus continues to shine in our world and we are called to be strong in the face of the hatred, violence, and darkness that do their best to turn the world from the Light! When we follow the light and love of God, we may just be led home by another way.

Pope Francis wrote that we strive "to see signs of God in the daily experiences of life... **God is light and he can be found also by those who seek him with a sincere heart.** An image of this can be seen in the Magi, who were led to Bethlehem by the star. For them God's light appeared as a journey to be undertaken, a star which led them on a path of discovery. The star is a sign of God's patience with our eyes which need to grow accustomed to His brightness... Christian faith in Jesus, the one Savior of the world, proclaims that all God's light is concentrated in him, in his 'luminous life'..."

The very clear and practical message of the Feast of the Epiphany is that it is a feast for all nations. Not just for the Jews. Not just for a chosen few, but for all! **The light of Christ (that star) that was followed by the Magi is a light that we must make known to the world today.**

We must take this "Good News" to the nations that Jesus, the Son of God, became flesh and lived among us. **It is a message that calls us all into action.** So come, let us continue to adore Him and receive the fire of God's love. Let us all do our part to proclaim the light of Christ to the world. A light sent to all people and all nations!

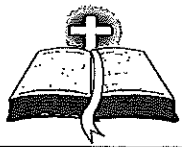
