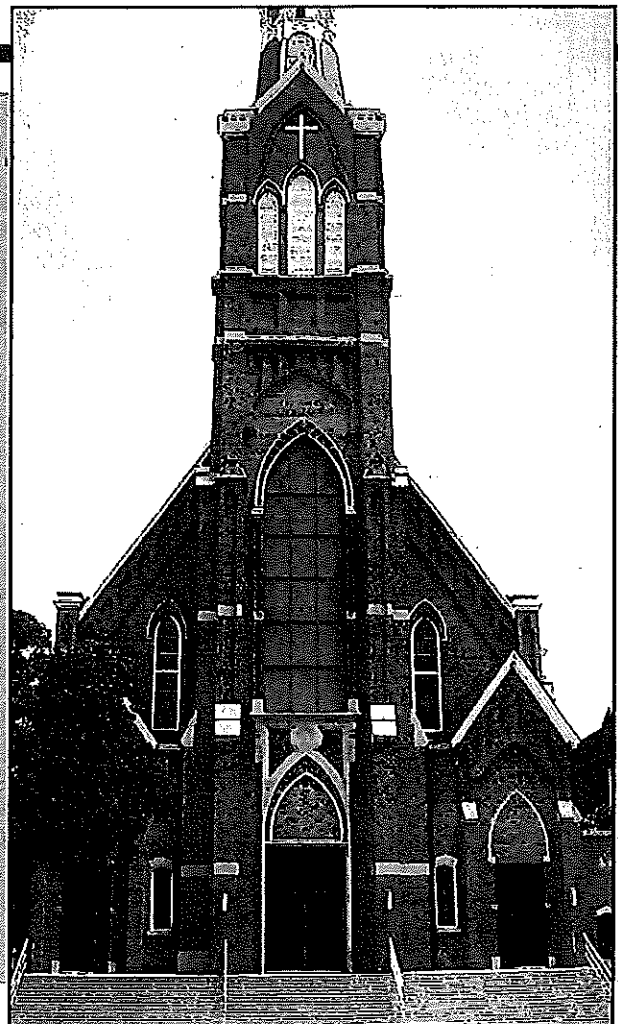

Who do you say I am? What do you believe?

Jesus may have been asking His Disciples this question, but every time we profess our Faith at Mass or bear witness to it in our daily lives, we are answering Jesus' question ourselves. More importantly, we, as individuals, are answering the question specifically asked of us as individuals.

At the Mass, in our Creed, we have gone from "I Believe" to "We believe" back to "I believe". This is the direct answer to Jesus' question "Who do you say that I am?" This is an important distinction to make as it is individuals who make the commitment to the faith. Furthermore, by asking us as individuals, Jesus is asking us to not follow a group of people but to follow Him and His mystical Body, the Church. In Luke's Gospel it tells us that just before this conversation, Jesus had been praying alone with his disciples. In fact throughout his Gospel, Luke portrays Jesus as being absorbed in prayer before important events occurred. A lesson to be learned!

At his baptism, Jesus was praying when the Holy Spirit descended upon him. Jesus prayed all night long before he chose his twelve apostles. It was in prayer we saw how he was "Transfigured". And it was in prayer as his passion was about to unfold, Jesus unburdened his heart to his Father in prayer. As Jesus shows us we must always rely first on prayer. *Who do you say I am?* The whole section of this Gospel, who do you say that I am, deals with the question of faith and comes to a climax with the proclamation of *Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the Living God*. He was preannounced from the Old Testament. He is love, God's love, God's Son.

Maybe Jesus was wondering if he had made any impact at all on the people, was his message getting through, how was he affecting them? I often ask myself the same question. When Jesus asked his disciples who do they say he was, he was not just challenging them, but inviting them into a deeper relationship with him. He wanted them as he wants us to learn to open our hearts to God in prayer and then receive his life and his love. Later on Luke tells us as the apostles learned how to pray, they became more effective ministers of the Word. In truth he already knew the truth, he didn't have to go to school for some unknown knowledge, he was knowledge. The phrase "Who do you say I am" deals with the question of faith and comes to a climax with the proclamation of Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). In discovering the truth our own faith must grow to a point where we can make a similar proclamation. There is always a far greater depth to discover and understand.
