

What is Ordinary Time in the Church?

The term ordinary in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many Catholic people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Even though the season of Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church, the fact that Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons reinforces this impression. Yet Ordinary Time is far from unimportant or uninteresting.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. It brings a time of exploring the earthly life of Jesus. How his life influences and changes our lives.

In any given year, there are either 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time. Because Easter is a moveable feast, and thus the Lent and Easter seasons "float" from year to year, the number of Sundays in each period of Ordinary Time vary from the other period as well as from year to year.

Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that! Just as there is nothing ordinary about the Mass. What we celebrate each Sunday is special to us and to the Church. That is we don't take our faith for granted. - Fr. Jerry

The Food Pantry

In addition to meeting by appointment, the Food Pantry has expanded to opening 5 times a month: the first 2 Tuesdays from 1pm-3pm and the first 3 Tuesdays from 7pm-8pm. Also, pantry items are delivered directly to the residents of Riverview Terrace and home bound individuals. Last year we provided food for 634 different individuals totaling 999 family pantry visits.

With United Way's funding we have arranged for monthly deliveries of Government Commodities from Toledo Seagate directly to our food pantry. We also made arrangements with the Fair Board to have Seagate Commodities unloaded at a Fair Ground building for distribution to Deshler, Holgate and McClure pantries. Additional food is donated or purchased as needed. Virgil Bohls Jr. and volunteers work to inventory and stock the pantry shelves.

The Help Line

The Saint Vincent de Paul cell phone is monitored by volunteers Monday through Friday 9am-4pm responding to various financial needs of our neighbors here in Henry County. Last year 444 people were helped through 188 vouchers for: rent, utilities, prescriptions, gas, help for the homeless, etc.

A computer program called Servware is now being utilized for tracking those receiving assistance through the help phone. It helps the volunteer with the phone determine if the person calling for help is eligible and how much we can provide. The volunteers also provide: information to further help by referring them to help available from other agencies, pantry locations & times, phone numbers and any other information we have.

Christmas for Kids

Thanks to the giving generosity of our parishioners and Čathy Majewski and her teams hard work, 84 children were provided Christmas gifts this past year through Christmas for kids.

Finances

Last fiscal year we had donations and other income totaling \$77,708. Significant portions of this were from: church collection \$26,371, FEMA grant \$5,000, Government Food Distributions \$33,400, and the rest was from donations and grants. We gave out \$87,430 in aid including: \$51,858 through the pantry, \$34,289 in vouchers, and \$1,283 Christmas for kids. Our operating expenses of \$2,532 for equipment, insurance, postage, non-profit report preparation, supplies, telephone and dues is under 3% of our total expenses.

The Society of Saint Vincent De Paul does much to help Napoleon and Henry County residents. All this work could never be accomplished without you. We were looking to the future with this new facility, but already it seems too crowded. With government cutting back on assistance, the need for our services is becoming more evident.

Thank You all for whatever help you have provided. Please continue to give of your time and resources. Invite your family, friends and neighbors to join us. Even an hour a month is greatly appreciated. God will bless you for it!
