What value do we place on life?

What is your life in Christ worth to you? Do we look on life as... *all life is precious in God's eyes*? Do you love His words more than gold and silver, as we sing in today's Psalm? Would you, like the characters in the Gospel today, sell all that you have in order to possess the kingdom He promises to us? If God were to grant any wish, would you follow Solomon's example in today's First Reading... asking not for a long life or riches but for wisdom to know God's ways and to desire His will? Knowing and loving God is more precious than any earthly treasure.

The background for today's Gospel, as it has been for the past several weeks, is the rejection of Jesus' preaching by Israel. The kingdom of heaven has come into their midst; yet, many cannot see that Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promises, a gift of divine compassion given so that they—and we—might live. If our life is precious, as we see it then in reality all life is precious. Having the vision of understanding life is precious and a gift from God... how could one look to destroy it?

Life is precious, more precious than any riches or precious gems. Be aware! Now extreme abortion advocates, including Planned Parenthood and the ACLU are turning their sight on Ohio to advance an extreme agenda to allow for painful, taxpayer-funded late-term abortions through all nine months of pregnancy. The ACLU and Planned Parenthood's proposed amendment will also eliminate parental rights if you have a teenager seeking an abortion or even a sex-change operation. Why you should vote YES on Issue 1

August 8, 2023 - Issue 1 - Vote Yes. A yes vote will raise the threshold to pass a constitutional amendment in Ohio from the present simple majority of 50% plus one to 60%. Making it 60% to pass an amendment will protect Ohio's Constitution from being co-opted by wealthy out-of-state interest groups that intend to sidestep Ohio's checks and balances by buying their way onto the ballot. A Yes vote will ensure that any future Constitutional amendments will be determined by a strong majority of Ohioans, not special out of state—interest groups looking to enrich themselves.

Ohio is one of only 18 states that even allow citizen-initiated constitutional amendments, and one of only 16 states that send them straight to the people for a vote. And of those 16 states, Ohio's 50% threshold for passing them is among the lowest. Ohio is one of the worst states in the nation when it comes to protecting its constitution. Our US Constitution requires two-thirds to pass an amendment. Groups opposing Issue 1 such as the Ohio Education Assoc., The ACLU, League of Women Voters and Planned Parenthood all require a two thirds vote to change their own constitution. These are all in sharp contrast to our existing Ohio 50% plus 1 rule.

In addition, currently without Issue 1, Signatures for a petition to change the State Constitution only need to come from 44 different counties. If Issue 1 passes, Signatures will need to come from all 88 counties. This would insure a more diverse and representative population of Ohioans to determine whether proposed amendments appear on the ballot by including rural areas in the decision. Furthermore, once mandatory signatures are collected they are checked to be sure the signers are all registered voters. Currently if not enough registered signatures are obtained, there is additional time to retrieve more. Passing Issue 1 would not allow that extra grace time for special interest.

November 7, 2023 Vote NO on the proposed Amendment that would amend Article 1 of the Ohio Constitution by adding Section 22, titled "The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety" amendment. It's name is intended by the abortion cartel to confuse and mislead voters into supporting an extreme abortion agenda. If passed and added to Ohio's Constitution, it would make abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy (including painful and cruel late term procedures on perfectly healthy babies) and would be the repeal of current health and safety provisions that protect women and the unborn children, and will certainly eliminate parental notification and consent before children seek out life-altering procedures like an abortion or gender-altering puberty blocker or surgery. Parents rights would be stripped away!

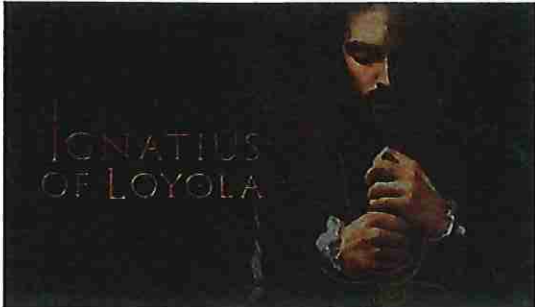

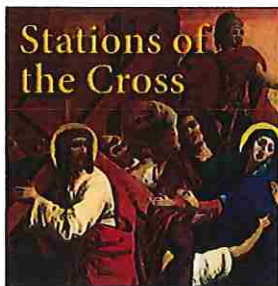

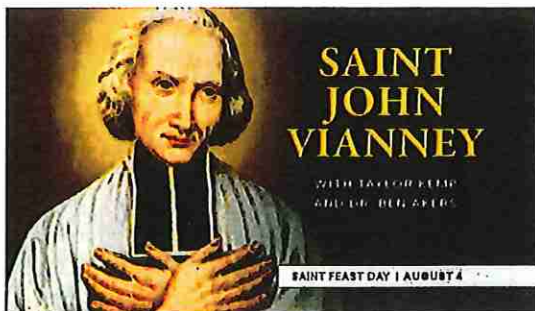
Ignatius of Loyola

ANOIDTING OF THE SICK The Parish Office should be notified whenever any parishioner is suffering from severe or prolonged illness. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered by request.

MARRIAGE "As soon as a couple makes a decision to marry and at least six months before the anticipated wedding date they are to make contact with the priest/deacons in order to begin the various steps of the Marriage Preparation Program" (Diocese of Toledo Directive). Official dates for wedding celebrations at St. Augustine Parish must be approved by the Pastor or Parish Deacon.
