

How often must I FORGIVE???

Yes, that is Peter's question, and in a sense it was an understandable question. Is there a limit or is there not a limit? One... is as good as it is meant to be. While more than one takes the point to a greater level. Limits are important, especially when they are addressed for our good; like advising one to only have one drink. So, in the issue of "how often should I forgive" is not really a numbers game here. Jesus says there is not a number with limits, there is no issue to how often. He says this not as to tell us there is a number, but more to help us see there should never be a limit. Yes, God is always ready to forgive... again, and again; he doesn't hold our sins against us... that is, unless we fail in seeking his mercy and forgiveness, he only wants us to change and seek forgiveness. The Gospel speaks of it this way... his (the debtor) entire debt was wiped away. If and when we seek God out... he is always ready to forgive our entire debt, we only have to express our sorrow, and not hold back, like some in the debtor story. Laws and Commandments are a reality of just doing what is right. Today's reading, however, stress the continuity of Jesus' teaching with the early Scripture. Remember this statement of his... "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have come to fulfill them..." (my translation)

So, how much should I forgive... No number is needed but the phrase UNLIMITED, that is how much God is ready to forgive if and when we are ready to seek him out. To the point; The servant who had been forgiven by the master fails in two ways; not only does he fail to deal compassionately with his fellow servant, but in so doing he betrays his master's standard of conduct. Similarly, life in the Church demands that we forgive not only because it is the compassionate thing to do, but because this is how God acts and expects us to act... so, we too must be quick and unstinting in offering forgiveness. - Fr. Jerry

Eucharistic Thought...

There are a number of times during the Mass when our posture indicates that we hold another in high honor. With respect to God, for example, we genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament or bow to the altar. You will see Fr. Jerry do both, depending on where my posture has me. I come out of the sacristy and genuflect to the tabernacle, where Jesus is truly present. You see me then as I come down the isle and bow to the altar before entering the sanctuary. Before I receive Jesus in Holy Communion I will genuflect. Bowing and or genuflecting is a jester of giving honor to one we receive, knowing we are not truly worthy, so, we do it out of total respect to, whom we know is truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.


