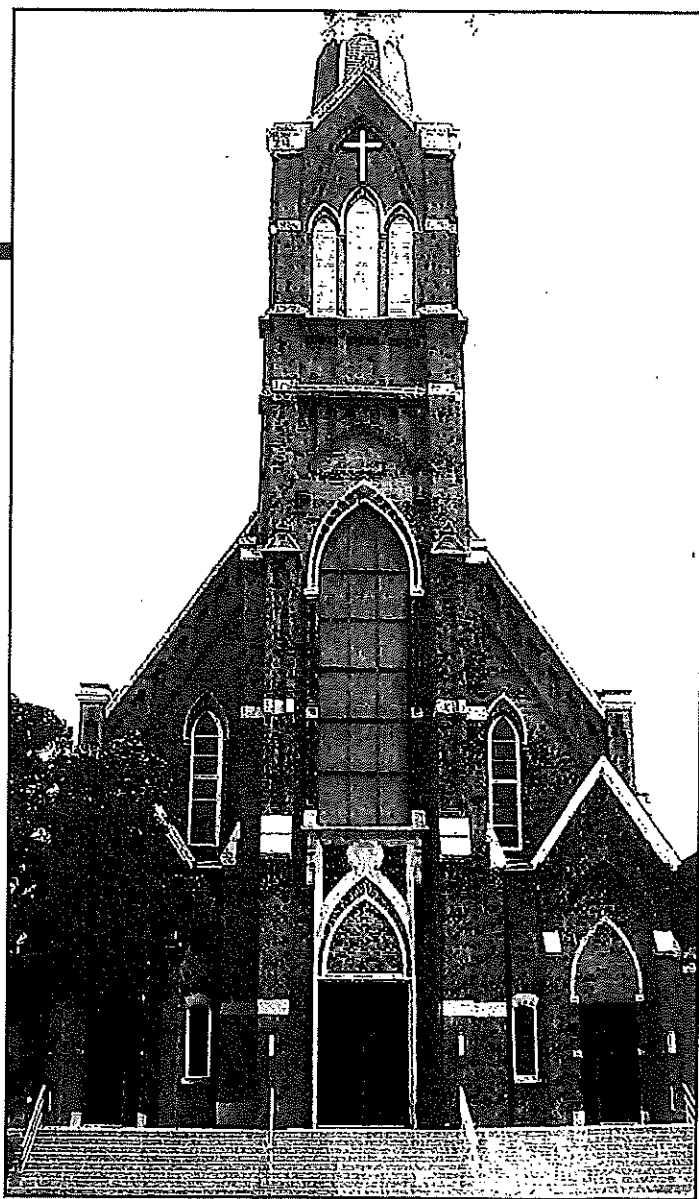

Preparing for the Coming...

The day of the Lord is coming, Paul warns in today's Epistle. What matters isn't the time or the season but what the Lord finds us doing with the new life, the graces He has given to us. We are coming to the end of Ordinary Time and rapidly move towards Advent Season. This is at the heart of Jesus' parable in today's Gospel. Jesus is the Master. Having died, risen, and ascended into heaven, He appears to have gone away for a long time.

It was in our Baptism, He has entrusted to each of us a portion of His "possessions," a share in His divine life. He has given us talents and responsibilities according to the measure of our faith. We are to be like the worthy wife in today's First Reading and the faithful man we sing of in today's Psalm. Like them, we should walk in the "fear of the Lord"—in reverence, awe, and thanksgiving for His marvelous gifts. This is the beginning of wisdom. This is not the "fear" of the useless servant in today's parable. His is the fear of a slave cowering before a cruel master, the fear of one who refuses the relationship that God calls us to.

God has called us to be trusted servants, fellow workers, using our talents to serve one another and His kingdom as good stewards of His grace. In this, we each have a different part to play. God always invites us, are we ready to except His invitation? We use the gifts we have been given to the best of our ability.

Though the good servants in today's parable were given different numbers of talents, each "doubled" what he was given. And each earned the same reward for his faithfulness—greater responsibilities and a share of the Master's joy. So let us resolve again in this Eucharist to make much of what we've been given, to do all for the glory of God. That we, too, may approach our Master with confidence and love when He comes to settle accounts. - Fr. Jerry

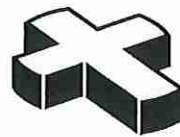

For more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has supported organizations that combat poverty and improve the lives of people in communities across the United States. 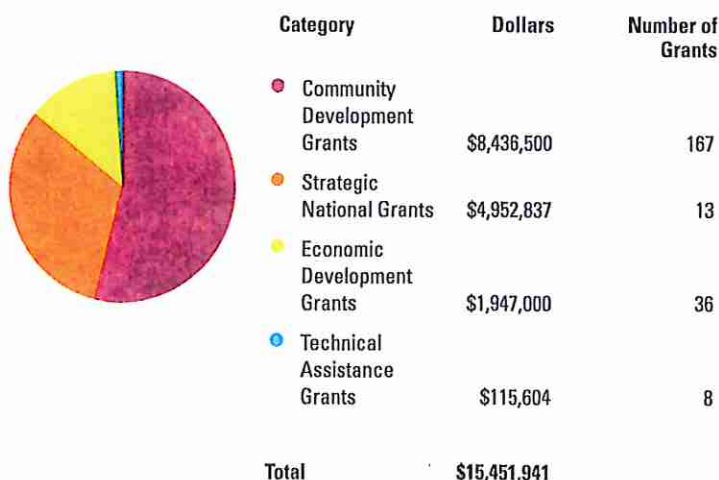
An effective response to natural disasters begins with effective planning before disasters occur. In New Orleans and surrounding areas in southern Louisiana, CCHD is helping Together New Orleans develop a project called Community Lighthouse, which will equip 85 congregations and community organizations with commercial-scale solar power and backup battery storage. This effort will form a network of response centers ready to serve

communities in a hurricane or other natural disaster once the solar power equipment is completely installed. By using solar power and backup batteries, the response centers can continue operating in the event of power loss—but they will also be using clean, renewable energy rather than fossil fuels that contribute to climate change and pollution.

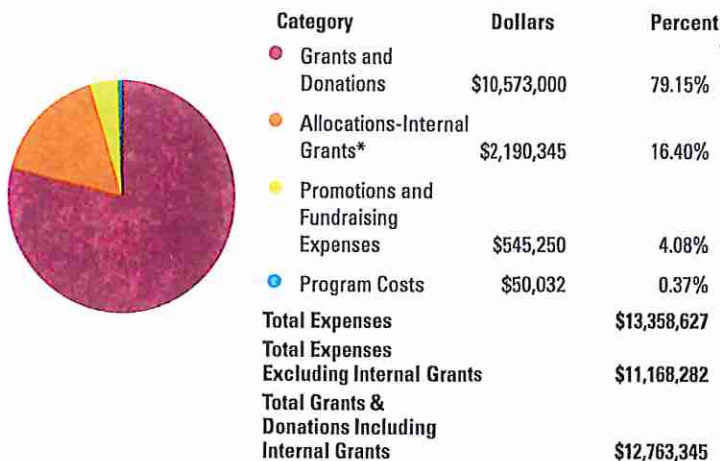

Por más de 50 años, la Campaña Católica para el Desarrollo Humano (CCHD) ha apoyado a organizaciones que luchan contra la pobreza y mejoran la vida de personas en comunidades en Estados Unidos. Las organizaciones financiadas por CCHD no solo abogan ante los líderes civiles, comerciales y líderes religiosos de la comunidad a fin de mejorar el acceso a viviendas asequibles, oportunidades laborales y educativas y los derechos de los inmigrantes—también responden rápidamente a las necesidades urgentes de las comunidades cuando éstas sufren emergencias.

Una respuesta efectiva a los desastres naturales empieza con una planificación eficaz antes que ocurra el desastre. En Nueva Orleans, y en las áreas adyacentes en el sur de Luisiana, CCHD está ayudando a *Together New Orleans* para desarrollar un proyecto llamado *Community Lighthouse*, el cual equipará de energía solar a escala comercial y el almacenamiento de baterías auxiliares a 85 congregaciones y organizaciones comunitarias. Este esfuerzo establecerá una red de centros de respuesta lista para servir

a las comunidades en caso de huracán, o de cualquier otro desastre natural, una vez que el equipo de energía solar esté completamente instalado. Al utilizar la energía solar y las baterías auxiliares, los centros de respuesta continuarán operando en el caso de perder energía—pero también utilizarán energía limpia y renovable, en lugar de combustibles fósiles que contribuyen al cambio climático y a la contaminación.

Cuando ustedes apoyan a CCHD, están ayudando a comunidades locales en todo el país a innovar y trabajar juntas para resolver sus propios y singulares desafíos. El veinticinco por ciento de sus contribuciones permanece en su diócesis para apoyar a las organizaciones que se encargan de responder a las necesidades de su comunidad para la vivienda, los trabajos y las oportunidades educativas—y para mantener las luces encendidas durante una tormenta.
