

Ordinary Time... Planning for what is not ordinary!

We have a number of words in the English language that come from the Greek word for time... "Chronos". One word is chronic which refers to something that lasts a long time. It tells us what time it is. It is e.g. January 21, 2024 at 9:15 a.m. The Greek also had a second word for time which was Kairos. Kairos meant another kind of time which we might call occasion. It tells us what it is time for. Like what a mother may say when she tells her child "it's time for you to get working on your homework."

Today in our first reading, it was time for the people of Nineveh to reform their lives and do penance. St. Paul tells us in our second reading "time is running out." He was encouraging the community to be detached from the things of this world. St. Paul's basic idea is absolutely true we must not get so preoccupied with everyday concerns that we forget about what is to come.

Sorry, salvation is not automatic, and we don't have forever... the one thing that is true, we all will die... sorry. The only thing that we can build our lives on that is reliable and permanent is the life we hope to enjoy with God in eternity. The kingdom of God is at hand... "Repent and believe in the gospel." Jesus used the Kairos when he said this is the time. Thank God now is the time, the opportunity for grace. Now is the season to open ourselves to God's life. Jesus calls for conversion, and is not just a message for the few, but for all. Conversion is ongoing. We all are in need of some form of conversion. Opportunities, as we all know, do not hang around forever. It's not tomorrow but now, just plain "Ordinary Time."

So the next time you look at your watch, don't just see what time it is, but thank God for the precious gift of time and ask yourselves... are you using it as best you can? There is an old saying "we couldn't do better than what we're doing right now." - Fr. Jerry

With the winter season upon us, please keep in mind the policy for Level 3 Snow Emergencies, established in 2014: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled."



MARRIAGE "As soon as a couple makes a decision to marry and at least six months before the anticipated wedding date they are to make contact with the priest/deacons in order to begin the various steps of the Marriage Preparation Program" (Diocese of Toledo Directive). Official dates for wedding celebrations at St. Augustine Parish must be approved by the Pastor or Parish Deacon.
