The Greatest Commandment... is LOVE!

It has been said... Love works for those who work at it. Yes, love does not come nicely packaged and colorfully wrapped. We must work at it; put it together little by little, day by day and piece by piece, because love just doesn't happen. Ancient Israel law gives some starting points for love. It begins by telling us to have marked respect for all others. It calls for equity in personal dealings. Wednesday is Ash Wednesday... but it's also Valentine's Day. It's a good time to reflect on Christ's love for us on this Valentine Day.

How does love relate to law? The two can seem opposed, a contrast to one another. Love... is a romantic dinner for two on a veranda overlooking a beautiful view. Law... it's a picture of an old man in a black robe, sitting behind a high bench with police officers at his side. Law and love, as strange as it may seem, are ultimately united. Without love, law is cold. Without law, love is a mere emotion. In scripture they show us there is a unity of the two pointing to a God of Love as the highest law. Love of God...

What does it mean to love God with all one's heart, soul, and mind? The heart can be understood as the seat of the emotions or affections, so loving God with the heart means cultivating our affection and emotional attachment to him. The soul can be understood as our spiritual nature, so loving God with one's whole soul is seeking spiritual union with him, the unitive way. Loving God with the mind is an intellectual endeavor, seeking to know God, to understand the truth about him, his nature, and his creation. An intellectual spirituality would be a failure to love God with the mind.

It says in Romans 5... "*God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.*" Yes, love of the Holy Spirit poured into our hearts is key. We can't live up to the command of love until we learn to love with the love of God which has been given us. Our own feeble efforts are not going to be sufficient.

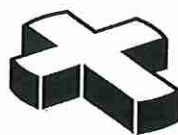

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy
With the winter season upon us, please keep in mind the policy for Level 3 Snow Emergencies, established in 2014: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in that geographic region are also cancelled."
People should always use prudential judgment when traveling. Stay safe and warm.

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though some may be made with animal fat.

Fasting means limiting oneself to **one full meal** on a given fast day (Ash Wednesday & Good Friday) this is for those Catholics who are 18 – 59. On fast days, two smaller meals are permitted if necessary.

Lenten Resolutions... As you make your Lenten resolutions, consider what God is calling you to do for the good of your own unique soul. Lent is a time for change! Undertake your own personal discipline in a spirit of humility asking for strength to persevere. A good spiritual adventure this Lent would be to stop by the church, light a small candle and pray the rosary for someone in your family in need or Pray the Stations of the Cross on Friday with others.

EXTRAORDINARY EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS -

At the "Lamb of God" please come forward, stand as always but when time to go into the Sanctuary, turn back toward the railing. The last person goes up (others follow) beside the railing, behind the ambo and over to stand to receive the Eucharist.

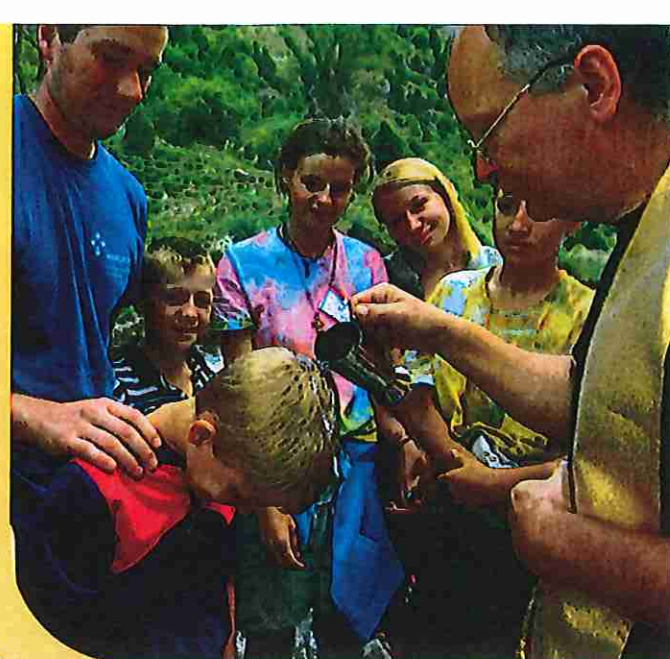
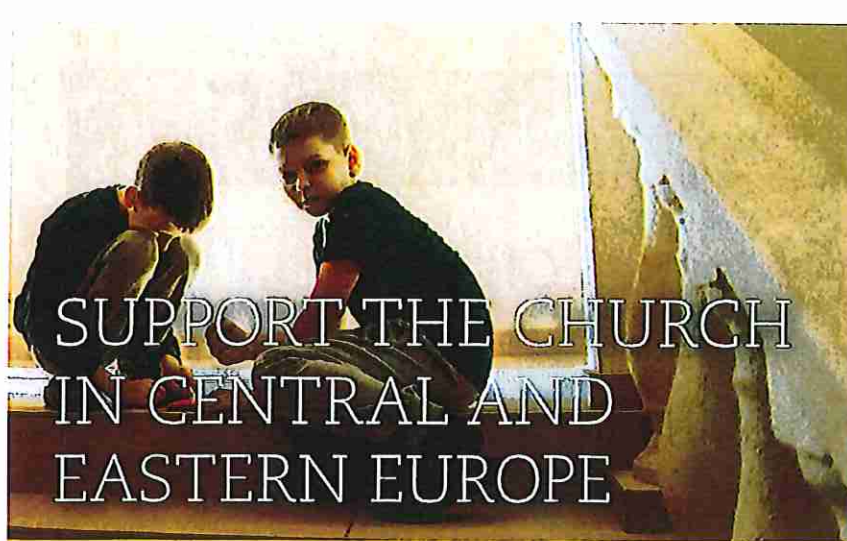

Catholics are called to evangelize their neighbors and loved ones by leading them into an encounter with Jesus Christ. When faithful disciples offer a visible and active presence in their communities, they live that calling through their works of mercy, their public worship, and their willingness to share the gospel message with those they meet.

For more than 30 years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has worked to restore a visible, active Church in Central and Eastern Europe and to build a hopeful new future in Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, and more than 25 other countries throughout the region. Your contributions to the USCCB's Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe fund grants to construct churches, enliven the faith of children and young people, and form disciples who live to help others encounter Christ.

Fact of Faith

WHY IS LENT FORTY DAYS?

The Lenten season is a time of preparation for the liturgical celebration of the suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. Many Catholics spend that time on the three practices of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is also a time to participate in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

The season of Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. If Sundays are excluded from the count, the season lasts forty days. The forty-day length of Lent is rooted in the biblical usage of the number forty. Forty is typically indicative of a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel.

Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert,
and he remained in the desert for forty days,
tempted by Satan.
He was among wild beasts,

and the angels ministered to him.
After John had been arrested,
Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God:
"This is the time of fulfillment.
The kingdom of God is at hand.

The forty-day period of Jesus' trial in the desert echoes a number of events in the Old Testament:

- The face of the earth was cleansed and purified during the promised period of days and nights that rain poured down during the great flood—"I will bring rain down on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and so I will wipe out from the surface of the earth every moving creature that I have made" (Gen 7:4).
- The face of the earth was renewed during a forty-day period after the mountain tops appeared and the waters of the great flood receded—"The tops of the mountains appeared. At the end of forty days Noah opened the hatch of the ark that he had made" (Gen 8:5-6).
- Moses spent forty years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery—"Moses fled when he heard this and settled as an alien in the land of Midian . . . Forty years later, an angel appeared to him in the desert near Mount Sinai in the flame of a burning bush" (Acts 7: 29-30).
- Moses fasted for forty days and nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tablets of the covenant—

"So Moses stayed there with the LORD for forty days and forty nights, without eating any food or drinking any water, and he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the ten commandments" (Ex 34:28).

- The Israelites spent forty years wandering in the desert, as a time of testing, trial and purification of the people, before reaching the Promised Land—"Now the Israelites had wandered forty years in the desert, until all the warriors among the people that came forth from Egypt died off because they had not obeyed the command of the LORD" (Jos 5:6; see Num 32:13).

- The prophet Elijah spent forty days in the desert before encountering God on Mount Horeb—"[Elijah] got up, ate and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb" (1 Kgs 19:8).

- The Ninevites were given forty days before God was going to destroy the city, allowing time for repentance and conversion—"Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, 'Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed,' when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth" (Jon 3:4-5).
