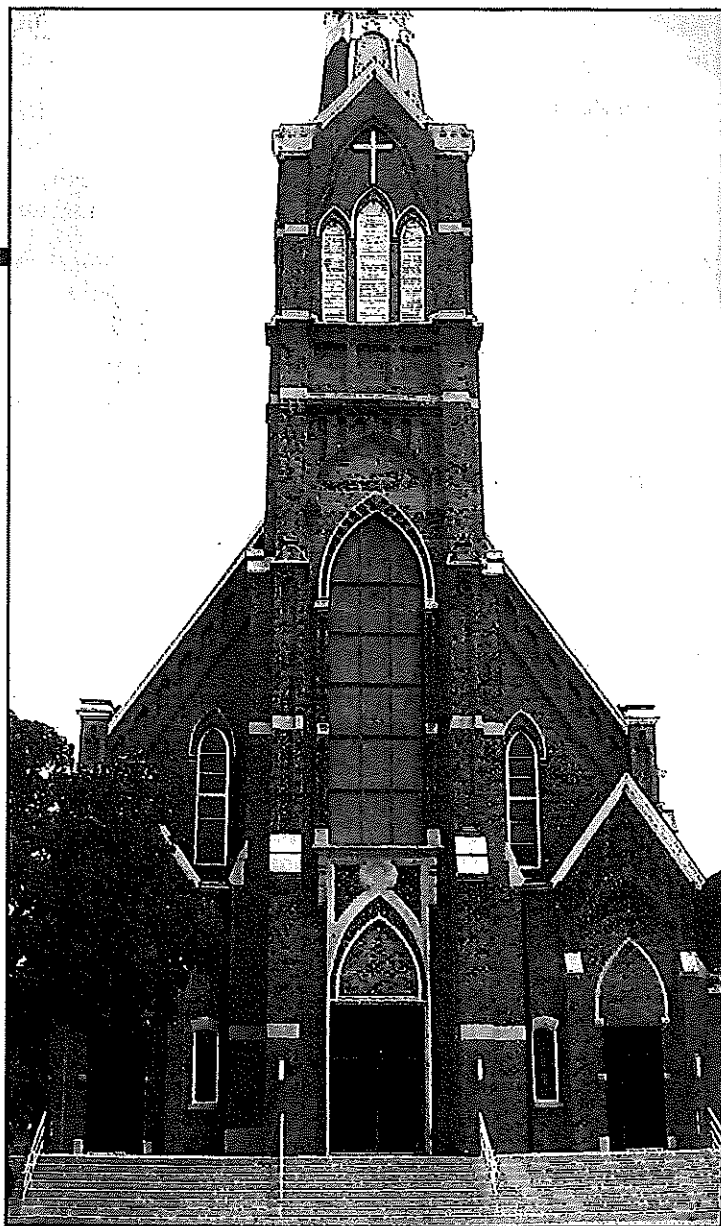

## ***And the sky became as dark as night...***

The subject of darkness is an enduring principle of the Bible which is always used to illustrate sin, evil, foolishness, blindness, and the power of satan.

On April 8 there will appear an eclipse of the sun, the moon will block out the sun. Probably... what was happening at the time of Jesus' crucifixion. The people we heard at that time were foolish, yes, they were, **Fickle People**... Yes, at one moment they'll yell out "**Hosanna**"... as we did on Palm Sunday, then they'll change and yell out "**Crucify Him**". As we did on Good Friday. I want to encourage you all not to be "**fickle**", but on the same aspect be ready in celebrating this time with our Lord, who gave of his all... **for our salvation**. Today on this Divine Mercy Sunday we reflect on His complete Mercy!

As we come to a conclusion of the Octave of Easter we begin by calling down God's blessing and His Divine Mercy on us.

For the love of God... and the love of neighbor, Jesus came into the world, lived out his mission, and died on the cross... Jesus accepted everything out of love for the Father, and for the love of us. He showed us the depth of his love and the value of that love. Today he is ready to give us an out-pouring of His Mercy!

Out of darkness, God brings us great light and complete Mercy. Out of sin, God grants us forgiveness... Out of death he gives us life. Out of evil comes light... **Jesus has gone before us, he has been raised... a new light will shine on us!**

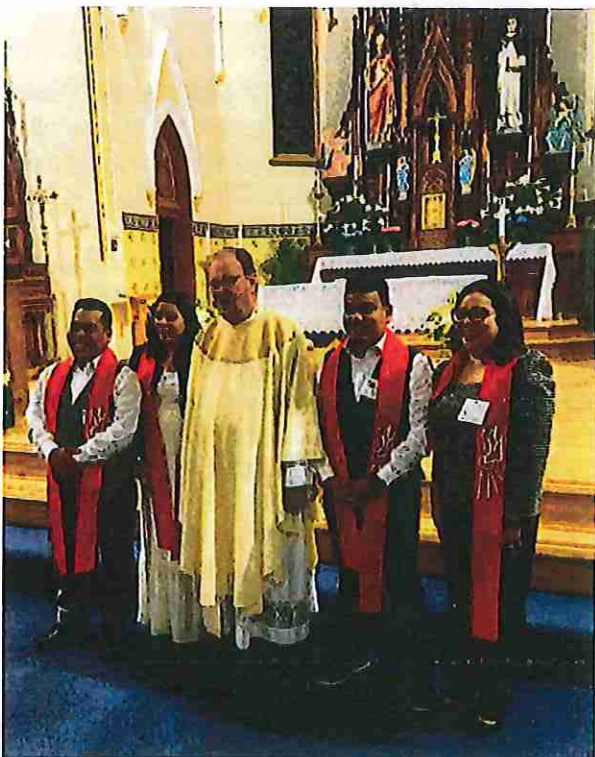

Divine Mercy Devotions... will be held this coming Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup>. at 3:00 p.m. here at St. Augustine. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the 10:30 Mass and remain until the conclusion of the service. Reconciliation will be offered on Saturday before from 3:30 – 4:15.

*The message of Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us and wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins. So that we will call upon Him with trust and receive His mercy.* – St. Pope John Paul II

Jesus will give us complete forgiveness... Alleluia, Alleluia! Yes for the sins and punishments if we do a few simple and easy tasks. We are asked to attend Mass this weekend, Divine Mercy Sunday. # REVEAL Brist's LOVE



After years of tension between Ukraine and the Russian Federation, Russian forces began a devastating war in February 2022 by invading Ukraine. In addition to killing and wounding many, the conflict has forced millions of Ukrainians to flee the country. Many refugees went to neighboring countries in Europe, but many others came to the United States. For decades, the Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) department of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has assisted refugees fleeing wars and persecution, and in 2022 it responded to the Ukrainian refugee crisis with two initiatives to help local communities welcome refugees.

The first initiative, Welcome Circles, is a community-led program that helps local groups work together to provide financial support and connect refugees to services such as health care and education. Although Welcome Circles are locally led, they are certified, vetted, and given ongoing guidance by MRS staff or local affiliate experts. MRS's support and guidance help each Welcome Circle accompany refugees effectively during the resettlement process. As of early 2023, the Welcome Circles program already had 25 circles engaging more than 200 volunteers and had expanded to welcome refugees from Haiti, Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela in addition to Ukraine.

Since 2010, MRS has led the second initiative, Parishes Organized to Welcome Immigrants and Refugees (POWIR), a program that works with select diocesan resettlement programs to empower parishes and local Catholic institutions so they can welcome and assist immigrants and refugees at the diocesan level. From May 2021 to January 2023, this diocesan support helped nearly 10,000 local volunteers, working in Catholic communities in 23 active POWIR

programs nationwide, to spend more than 100,000 volunteer hours working with and on behalf of about 24,000 clients.

Funds received through The Catholic Relief Services Collection allow MRS to help victims of war and oppression begin new lives in welcoming, supportive communities through innovative initiatives like Welcome Circles and POWIR. In addition to MRS, the collection supports other Catholic organizations that aid victims of persecution and natural disasters, provide legal services to poor immigrants, and advocate for the powerless.
