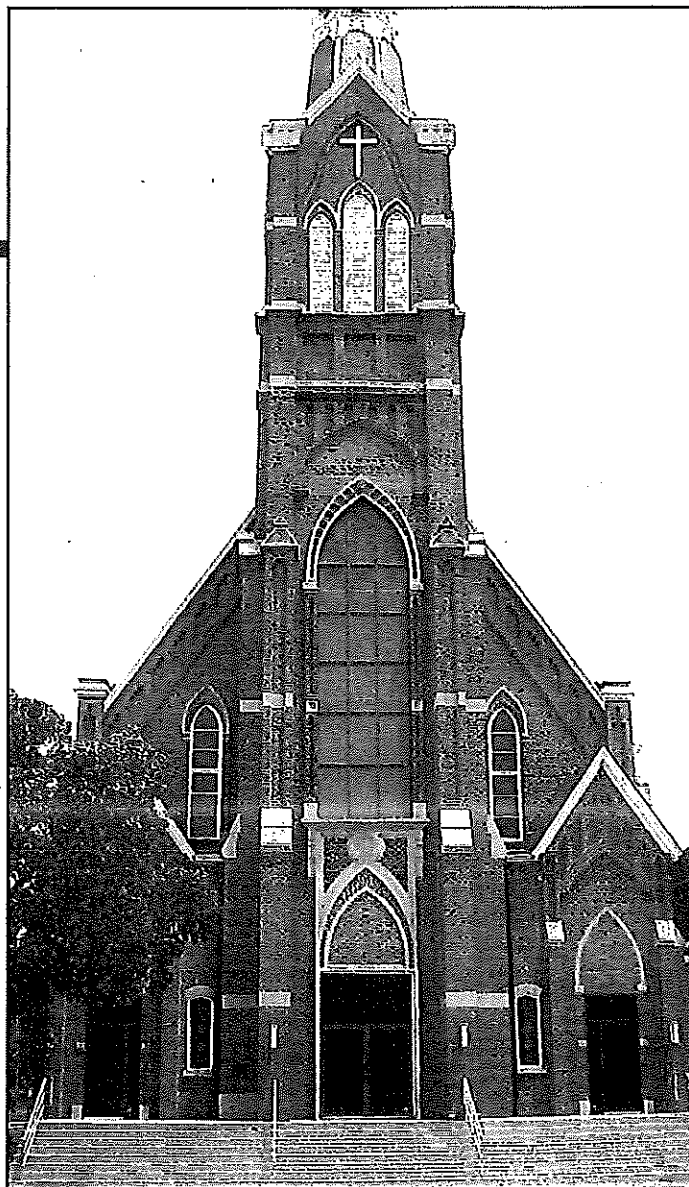

VICTORY... What brings victory in our lives?

"When you go out to battle against your enemies and see horses and chariots and people more numerous than you, do not be afraid of them; for the Lord your God, who brought you up from the land of Egypt, is with you. When you draw near the battle, the priest shall come near and speak to the people. He shall say to them, Hear, O Israel, you are approaching the battle against your enemies today. Do not be fainthearted. Do not be afraid, or panic, or tremble before them. For it is the Lord, your God, who goes with you to fight for you, against your enemies and give you victory".
(Deuteronomy 20)

Sadly, because they, Adam & Eve, had been given dominion over all things, all of creation including the earth itself was cursed along with them. Every problem we have today originated from their decision to choose Satan's knowledge and wisdom over God's! They like Peter denied the Lord as Jesus is the embodiment of God's knowledge, the Word, the Light of mankind. They were therefore cut off from the Lord's knowledge, left in the darkness of Satan's realm and rightfully cursed. This cursed condition has been passed on to all their descendants, which is all, the human race before baptism! There is a difference between a curse and eternal judgment. 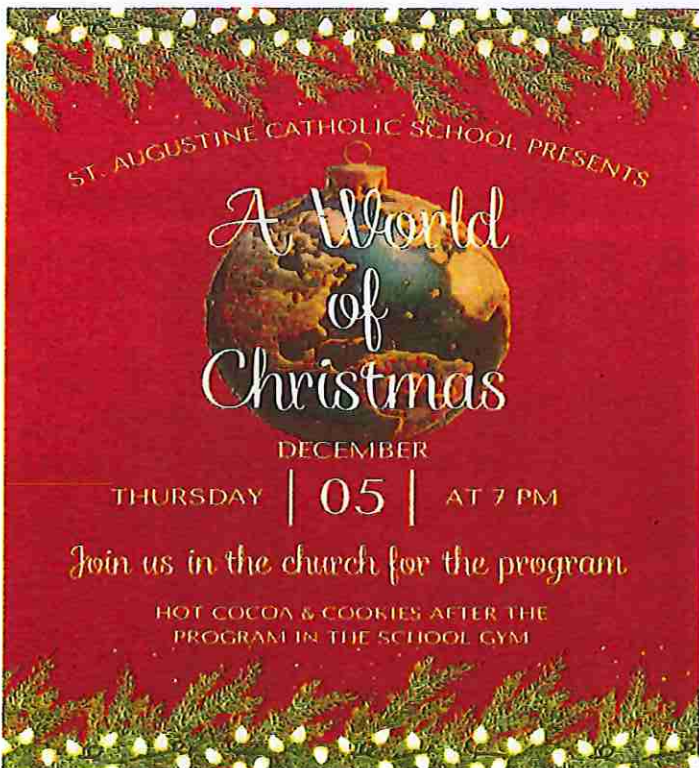

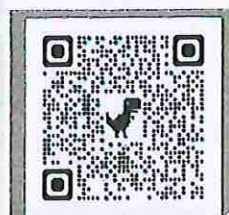
