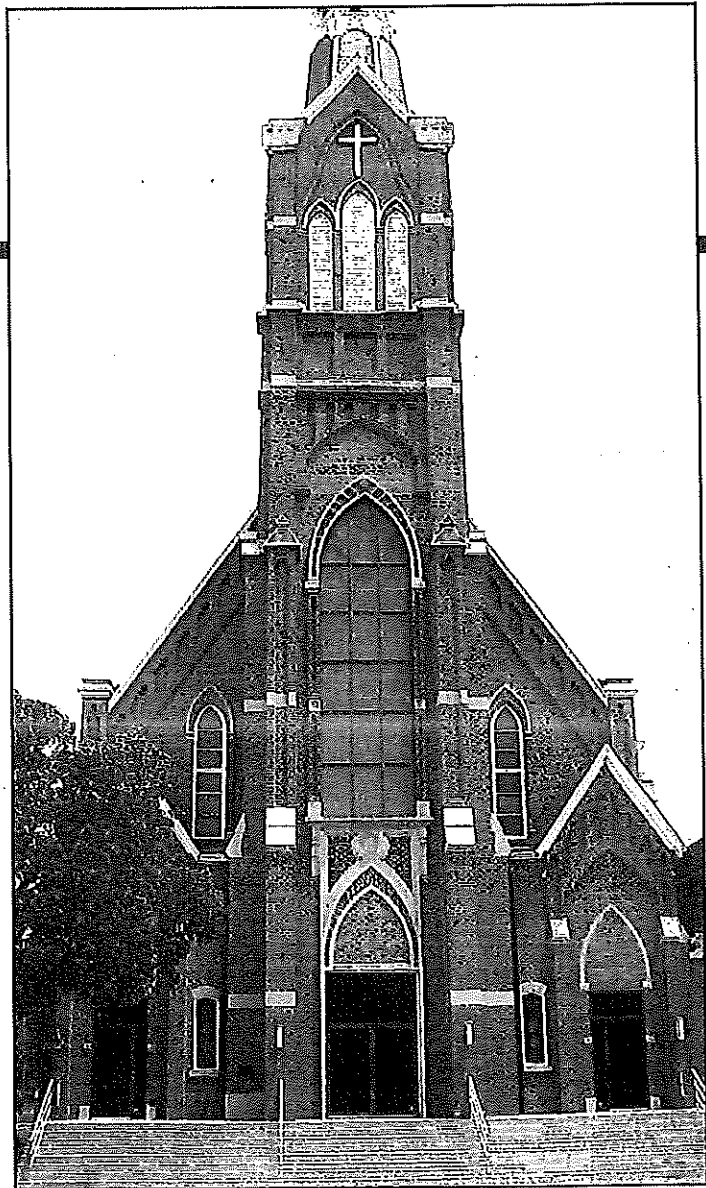

Who's to Blame?

As we approach the Penitential Season of Lent this coming Ash Wednesday, we kind of hear a warning from Jesus about sin. Don't focus on the sins of your brother, your sister, or your neighbor; look at your own sins. We begin our journey into God's word today with some ancient proverbs collected by Sirach to teach morality. What we say and what we do reveal the kind of person we are. St. Paul in our second reading explains that because of Jesus, sin has been defeated and death cannot win in the end... unless we let it. At the end of his letter, he leaves a farewell message... "be... fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain". Yes, Jesus even warns his disciples about being blind to one's own sins while at the same time judging others for theirs.

I believe every year; Lent affords us the opportunity to recognize our sinfulness and our need for God's forgiveness through reconciliation. Yes, Jesus goes dramatically to the cross for us. We in turn walk that path with him, our little Way of Cross. Gathering for Mass this weekend on the eve of Lent, we come to commit ourselves to recognize our faults and change our lives; resolving to follow the Lord more faithfully. - Fr. Jerry

FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

FRIDAY ADORATION will take place each First Friday of the month after 8:45 Mass until 5:30 p.m. We will have a sign-up sheet in the back of the church and would appreciate folks filling the day so that our Lord is not exposed on the altar without anyone present. Tears of Christ . . .

The "Tears of Christ" is a prayerful Lenten Meditation book made available for your personal Lenten journey. It consists of a couple of pages for daily meditation this Lenten Season. In understanding Tears of Christ: We look into Jesus' humanity and empathy. The phrase "Jesus wept" highlights Christ's full participation in human emotions, including grief and sorrow. This offers comfort, knowing God understands our pain. Theological significance: Jesus' tears reveal God's love for humanity, his sorrow over sin and death, and the redemptive power of suffering. They invite us into a deeper, more emotional experience of faith. Jesus wept, not merely from the deep thoughts of his understanding but from spontaneous tenderness, from the goodness and mercy, the encompassing loving-kindness and exuberant affection of the Son of God for his own work, and the human race.

This book is a precious insight that takes us to the heart of the interior life of St. John Henry Newman (1801-1890), from the treasures of which these meditations are offered as a devotional aid for the season of Lent. Drawn chiefly from his sermons and gently modernized, these meditations offer a share in the fruit of his contemplation, that we might better enjoy with him the one thing which is in all to us, which is to live in Christ's presence, to hear his voice, to see his countenance. Have a faithful prayerful Lent.

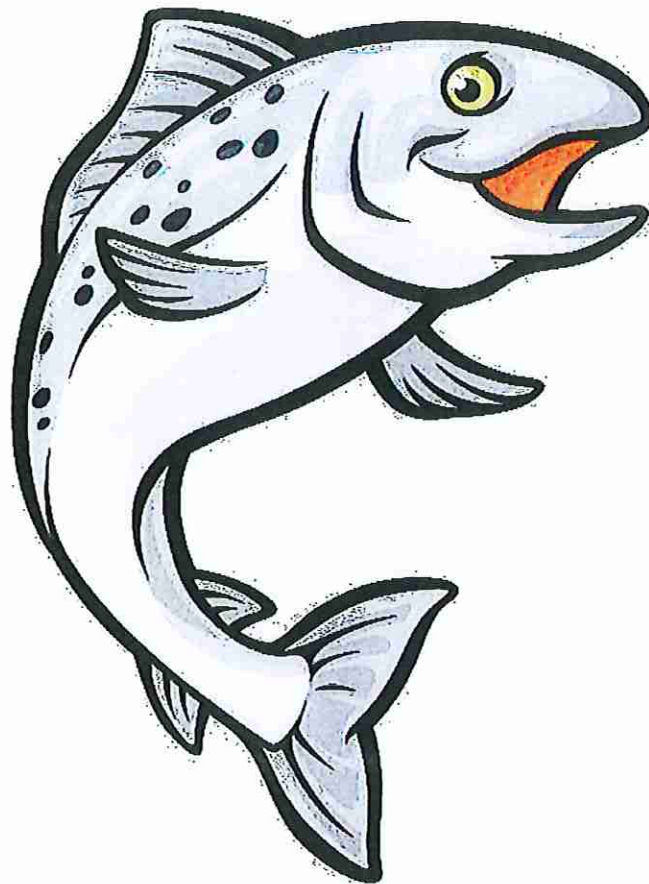

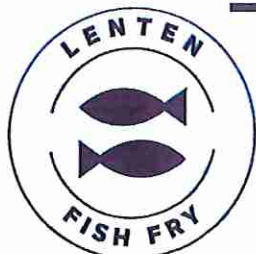

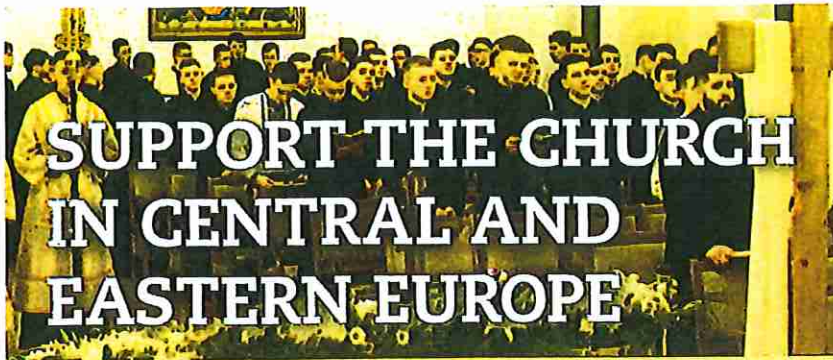

RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE

Decades ago, the bishops of the United States established a program to aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe and help it rebuild after decades of communist oppression. The program is funded by an annual collection taken up in dioceses across the United States. That response continues today, even as the rebuilding Church faces the new challenges of war and the mass migration of refugees.

From the beginning of the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 and the subsequent war, the Catholic Church has vigorously responded to the ongoing humanitarian catastrophe by offering shelter, food, medicine, and necessities—as well as spiritual support and comfort—to displaced persons and other war victims. Among those leading this charitable response are the consecrated religious sisters and brothers of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. Whether by providing shelter and basic necessities to internally displaced persons who have fled their homes for safety in other regions of the country, or by helping priests provide pastoral and humanitarian support in areas where the fighting is most heavy, these sisters and brothers have truly showed Christ's mercy to those most in need.

For them, the human suffering of war is compounded by the unique challenges that wartime conditions present for them as consecrated religious. Questions of how religious communities balance ministry to the needy with the sisters and brothers' needs to live their vows of prayer and community under such extraordinary circumstances require thoughtful responses.

Aided by funding from the collection, the Patriarchal Curia of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church gathered sisters, brothers, and their superiors for the spiritual renewal of a pilgrimage as well as formation sessions to address the challenges facing their communities. Your support for the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe is a vital way for you to make a tangible difference in the lives of Catholic in Ukraine and more than 25 other countries in Central and Eastern Europe.

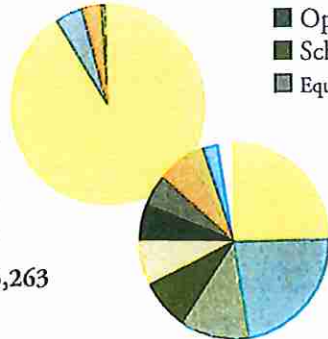
