Palm Sunday... Hosanna in the Highest...

All four Gospels include the account of the Triumphal Entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem: in John's Gospel it says... The next day, the news that Jesus was on the way to Jerusalem swept through the city. A large crowd of Passover visitors took palm branches and went down the road to meet him. They shouted, "Hosanna Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hail to the King of Israel!"
Don't be afraid, people of Jerusalem. Look, your King is coming, riding on a donkey's colt.

Palm Branches in Ancient Times

Date palms are majestic, tall trees that grow abundantly in the Holy Land. Their long and large leaves spread out from the top of a single trunk that can grow to more than 50 feet in height. In Bible times, the finest specimens grew at Jericho (which was known as the city of palm trees), and along the banks of the Jordan is where a lot of them grew. In ancient times, palm branches symbolized goodness, well-being, grandeur, steadfastness, and victory. They were often depicted on coins and important buildings. Even King Solomon had palm branches carved into the walls and doors of the temple: Yes, on the walls all around the temple, in both the inner and outer rooms, he carved cherubim, palm trees and open flowers. (1 Kings 6:29)

Palm branches were regarded as tokens of joy and triumph and were customarily used on festive occasions (Leviticus 23:40, Nehemiah 8:15). Kings and conquerors were welcomed with palm branches being strewn before them and waved in the air. Victors of Grecian games returned to their homes triumphantly waving palm branches in their hands. This Palm Sunday we too take up our palms and sing out Hosanna in the highest. Then afterwards we take these blessed palms and place them in our homes; usually behind a crucifix. — Fr. Jerry

Golgotha or Calvary...

Golgotha is the Aramaic name of the location where Jesus was crucified outside of Old Jerusalem. We hear John's Gospel (Jn. 19:16-18, "So they took Jesus, and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called *The Place of a Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha*". There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them." *Golgotha* is also mentioned in Matthew and Mark's Gospel. Sometimes also referred to as *Calvary* counting this reference, all four gospels make reference. There has been some dispute regarding the precise location of this hill, but the traditional place is underneath the **Church of the Holy Sepulcher** in the northwest (Christian) quadrant of the Old City. The church is built over a point called the **Rock of Golgotha**, the supposed site of the crucifixion. As the name of the church suggests, the building also includes a cave-like tomb where Jesus' body was laid. The church's construction was overseen by St. Helena, the mother of Constantine, in A.D. 325 and has long held prominence as the traditional location of the crucifixion of Jesus.

The location of *Golgotha* is of interest to us because of the events that have taken place there coincide with this week. One fateful day, Jesus carried a cross, helped by a man named Simon, toward a hill where He was hung by nails through His wrists and feet. He hung between two thieves as one of three sentenced to death that day. One of these two men understood who Jesus was and asked the Lord to remember him in the kingdom. Jesus responded with a promise of glory soon to be revealed: "*Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise*" (Luke 23:43). It's why Jesus was shedding His blood—to forgive and redeem sinners who placed their faith in Him. Still today, this hill we call *Golgotha* or *Calvary* stands as a reminder of Jesus' great sacrifice—the only sacrifice capable of forgiving sin and reconciling man with God. Thanks Be to God!
