

#### The Why's of Miracles...

The boring dictionary definition is "an event that is contrary to the established laws of nature and attributed to a supernatural cause." I guess, that'll work. Not the real guestion... So, when God steps in and does something truly impossible - that's a miracle. In life I think sometimes we water-down important words by making them so commonplace. I think of these examples... I got the job... it's a miracle! My headache went away just in time for the movie... it's a miracle! My little one ate a green bean... it's a miracle! Although there is a slight chance those examples were true miracles, most likely God did not make the green beans appear to be Mac and Cheese so the young girl would eat them.

We just use the word "miracle" to describe improbable events that we are thankful for. The biblical authors go to great length in many of the miraculous accounts to set-up the impossibility of the situation. Bringing sight to someone born blind certainly reveals a miracle. Stopping a storm immediately is more of a miracle than the weather being clear in time for the church potluck after church. Raising someone from the dead is a miracle; an anti-bacterial clearing up an infection is not.

Now, I'm not saying we shouldn't pray for such things, we should, and that it's not God's blessing when our prayers are answered, but the term "miracle" implies a supernatural intervention that defies human reason, logic, and capability.

The Gospels contain many well attested accounts of miracles. It makes total sense that God the Creator of natural order would and could choose to suspend some natural order occasionally to reveal His power. At the heart of our faith stands the greatest miracle of all... the very Resurrection of Jesus Christ! "If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain, and our faith has been in vain." Yes, God is a miracle worker, and continues to be, so to strengthen our trust in His providence, love, and divine presence. - Fr. Jerry

The program is an extension of the St. George Deanery program, which I was part of when I was in the Deanery 3 years ago. Now we are extending the mission in the Napoleon area and beyond, regardless of faith. We understand it is a very unique loss that mother's and families encounter. And we believe that life begins at conception, it is a loss that deserves to be recognized, mourned and honored.

Our Goals: Is to provide practical and spiritual information, compassionate support, education, options and resources on infant loss to local families, parishes and healthcare organizations: To provide ways to memorialize and honor the babies who were with us for only a short time. To love others through this corporal and spiritual work of mercy at a great time of need and to validate, honor and advance the Church's pro-life teaching that all life is sacred and that life begins... at the moment of conception.

At the heart of any formation is "Spiritual" which is the building foundation for all growth in holiness. Let us help each other on our faith journey. After all, we are all part of the Body of Christ. As St. Paul tells us in 1Corinthians, "The Body has many parts, all with unique gifts." May we all work together in building up the Body of Christ in our faith community... Our goal is to create the culture as we put Faith into action... a step in the right direction!

## Mary's Assumption - Queen of Heaven & Earth

The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary is August 22, but before the coronation of the Queen of Heaven can begin, she has to be transported from earth to heaven. I have often considered if she was concerned at all. I'm assuming that she trusted her son completely.

The Blessed Virgin Mary must be "assumed" into Heaven, as she is not Divine like her Son. Jesus "ascends" into Heaven.

Simply put, when Mary's earthly life was over, she was taken up, body and soul, into heaven. It's not about her dying and then being resurrected later (like the general resurrection at the end of time), but rather, a unique privilege granted to her by God. Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory.
