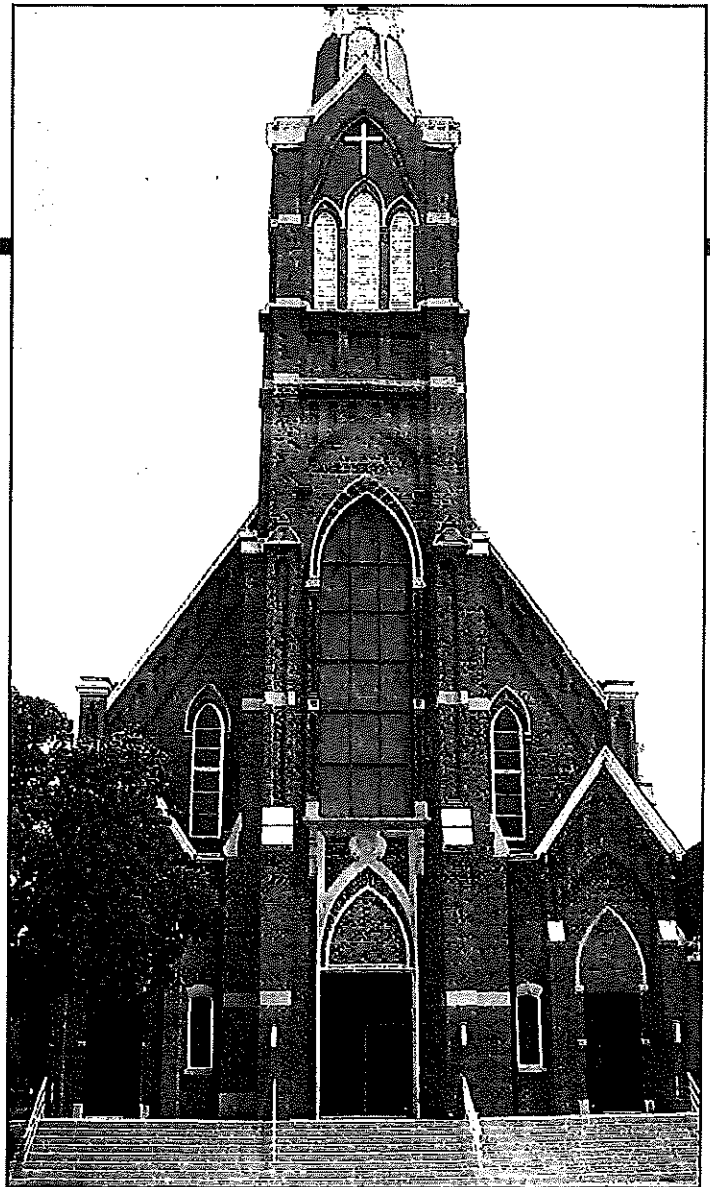

This Sunday, we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross...

The question... *how do we reflect on the cross?* How does the Cross challenge our understanding of love and sacrifice in daily life?

Real love has a cost, and unfortunately we know the cost. All we have to do is look at the Cross of Jesus to see the price that was paid to redeem us. It was a price willingly paid by our Lord, when He chose to die on the Cross to set us free. A tree with a purpose. A tree with God's dream.

The world tells us to run from suffering, but Jesus shows us how to endure it patiently. That is one reason why the Cross is so essential to the proclamation of our faith. When we look at the Cross, we recognize that God in His great mercy forgives us when we repent and turn to Him. I believe it is truly unfair to look at a cross without Jesus on it. Yes, something is missing... The reason!

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him... might have eternal life. (John 3:16) Yes, a concise summary of why the cross of Christ is so central to our faith. Remember it's true real love with a cost. It's a love God wants to share with us so we can share it with others. Love and Life, this is the message of the cross. For us there is this leap of hope. Maybe not a bed of roses... but it still will smell just as sweet!

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) Yes, becoming a Catholic is a process...a journey...a learning experience of becoming Catholic. **Thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church?** Have questions about the faith? Want to explore the faith more deeply? The full content of the Catholic faith can be organized into four categories: Basic beliefs (the faith itself) - How to live (morality) - How Catholics worship (liturgy) and Prayer.

In exploring the truth of our faith we go to the very essence of it through the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which contains the hidden energy of the Good News, scripture itself. When we have become convinced...we are able to convince others. Growing in faith is understanding the truth. A golden opportunity awaits all through this process.

The Catholic OCIA process is a good model of basic faith development. New classes will begin on Wednesdays, the first one is September 24, at 6:30 p.m. If you have questions please call the parish office or speak to one of the faith team members.
