

### Being motivated by the Word of our Lord...

Some of you may remember an old ad campaign for Memorex cassette tapes from the 70's. Their positioning statement was, Is it alive or is it Memorex? Their most memorable commercial was showing a jazz singer's voice breaking a glass. Then using one of their tapes, they recorded and played back her singing that... also broke a glass. Is it alive or is it Memorex? I am not deeply connected to music or have been blessed to do my own professional live and recorded singing. And, I don't use Memorex tapes.

But, there is no mistaking a recording vs. live performance. There is a certain depth and a truth that is present in a live performance, that both the conscious and subconscious respond to. It's an experience that cannot be fully captured in a recording. Today's version of the Memorex question is Ah–is it really her or is it not? And don't we at times find ourselves similarly questioning a moment of someone's authenticity? Are they being real, or are they up to something? If we aren't careful, this can also be true of our times of our statements with others. Maybe we find ourselves even questioning... is that really true or

Applying voice techniques is good until it's not! Proverbs 11:3 comes to mind: "The honesty of the upright guides them; the faithless are ruined by their duplicity."

If we aren't properly focused, we can speak with a type of duplicity: being "technique-y" rather than leading with honest care and concern. This happens when we are overly focused on the mechanics of technique to get what we want. Worst case, we unknowingly dehumanize those we want to help. It's the tool/technique that is a utility. The people we want to help know consciously or subconsciously when they are being "technique-ed." This moment feels impersonal and could also feel manipulative. It can create a barrier and bruise trust.

Yes, one must have the outcome at the top of mind, and the outcome in mind could be the issue. Ask yourself, what do I want to "build" with what I have been blessed with? Skill? Morale? Teamwork? Or purely, a space with less headaches for me? Less fires to put out? Or to get someone off my back? Yup. It's one of those moments to check in and see if it is time to get out of the way. Getting out of the way is letting God be in charge. -Fr. Jerry


