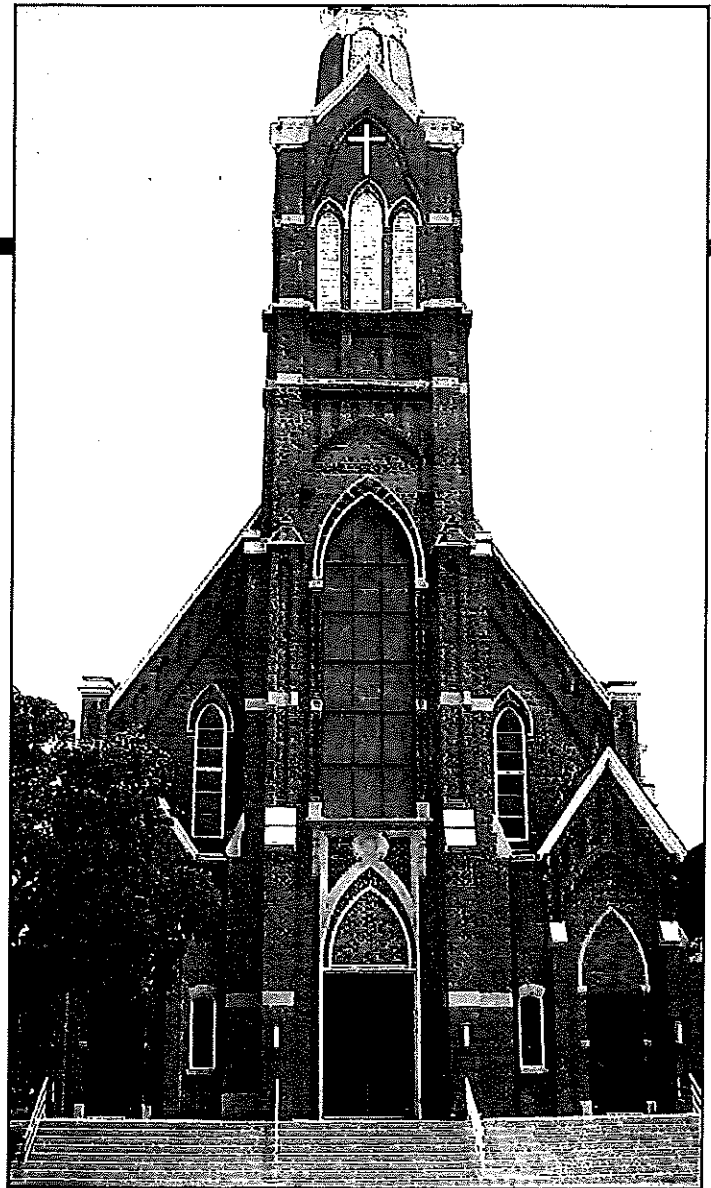

SAFE ENVIRONMENT AND COMPLIANCE AUDIT - The Diocese of Toledo is in compliance with the articles of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Charter)* of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Every year, the Diocese dutifully submits the necessary documentation required by the USCCB for a diocese to be in compliance.

Every three years an on-site audit is conducted, when not only all necessary documentation is dutifully submitted, but in addition, Pastoral Center, parish and diocesan school employees are interviewed, concerning practices and protocols related to creating and maintaining a safe environment for our children and youth.

The last 3-year audit was conducted in September 2024 and all audited Articles within the *Charter* were found to be compliant. The next on-site audit will be conducted in 2027.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric, or any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (419) 214-4880 or by mail at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue, Toledo, Ohio 43604.

A Strong Start in the Faith...OCIA Process

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) Yes, becoming a Catholic is a process...a journey...a learning experience of becoming Catholic. **Thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church?** Have questions about the faith? Want to explore the faith more deeply? The full content of the Catholic faith can be organized into four categories: Basic beliefs (the faith itself) - How to live (morality) - How Catholics worship (liturgy) and Prayer.

In exploring the truth of our faith we go to the very essence of it through the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which contains the hidden energy of the Good News, scripture itself. When we have become convinced...we are able to convince others. Growing in faith is understanding the truth. A golden opportunity awaits all through this process.

Every generation raises a voice that sparks questions... Yes, it stirs conversations and challenges the status quo. Just as in scripture there were rebellious men; so, to in our world there are rebellious people and nations. Even in the voices today comes our challenges. Many are often igniting convict. Unfortunately, when truth is spoken, we will often seem to be divided. In every generation this is present. Remember, everything we hear is either coming from God or from the devil. Every generation must come to realize nothing happens that is good unless we make it happen. To choose the truth is not random in the hands of God. There is a bigger picture in Gods truth that will become a divine signpost for us to see the truth.

God can and does use small voices like ours to spark others to awaken those most in need. God's will be still present to use us to see his signpost to lead us with a deeper spiritual movement to awake others. It is... truth and light verse darkness and doubt. We are called; we are the chosen ones to awaken us to others. Yes, the world is calling us to what is to come. He is speaking, stay awake... yes, he is coming. Yes, the gospel today is a reminder of the urgency of discipleship. The time is now. Now is he time to respond decisively to God and others. Jesus does not commend the steward's dishonesty; he commends his prudence in responding quickly to the crisis of his future. Disciples should be as decisive in conducting their affairs, for what is at stake is not security in this world but eternal life. So, we are to treat everything of this world in relation to what is of ultimate worth. If you want to change the world? Go first and change the ones around you. - Fr. Jerry

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A Catechists... Lots of people give catechesis in the Church; teaching the principles of the faith to those preparing for baptism, who are called "catechumens." The same is true for the instruction of Christians, young or older, preparing for a sacrament.

The Code of Canon Law notes that, to a degree, every Christian has a role to play in teaching the faith and that "solicitude for catechesis belongs to all members of the Church according to each one's role." Parents and godparents, for example, have a particular role to play in the education of children in the faith after baptism, and pastors have a particular responsibility to see to the "catechetical formation" of the people in their parishes.

Canon law also explains that each level of the hierarchy of the Church, from the Holy See to the diocesan bishop, is to issue norms for catechetics, and to make sure that there is appropriate material and education available to form and educate Catholics.

In this day and age when we can look up just about anything online and determine what is true and what is real, it's tough to have to rely on faith. But this is what God has asked us to do for thousands of years. One day our time on earth will come to an end... or the world itself will come to an end, and yes, no internet source knows when that will be.
