

Getting Fed... Who was killed at the altar defending the name of Jesus?

One of the most dramatic episodes in Church history centers on a friendship turned tragedy: the bond between Thomas Becket and King Henry II of England. What began as camaraderie ended with Becket's martyrdom, and his story still speaks to the timeless call to defend the Church's freedom.

Thomas Becket was a scholar, a priest, and a loyal friend to King Henry. When Henry appointed him Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162, he expected Becket to be a cooperative ally. Instead, Becket transformed. He had been elevated to shepherd of the English Church, he embraced his new role with uncompromising fidelity to Christ, and to the rights of the Church. But, conflict arose quickly. King Henry sought to limit clerical privileges and bring clergy under royal courts. Becket resisted, insisting that the Church must maintain its own authority and spiritual autonomy. What began as a political dispute became a moral and spiritual stand. Becket chose fidelity to God over obedience to the king.

The tension climaxed on December 29, 1170. In Canterbury Cathedral, four knights — believing they acted on Henry's angry command — entered the peaceful sanctuary and murdered Becket at the altar. His last words were said to be "*For the name of Jesus and the defense of the Church, I am ready to die.*" Becket's martyrdom shocked Europe. Rather than quelling resistance, it ignited a profound wave of reverence for the archbishop, who had laid down his life for the Church's freedom. Pilgrims flocked to his tomb. Miracles were reported. King Henry himself performed public penance. The clash between crown and Church was not forgotten, but Becket's witness became a testament to the conviction that no earthly power is greater than the authority of God. Becket's life and death remind us that the Christian vocation calls us to stand up for truth, even at a great cost. His legacy echoes in the ongoing need for believers to uphold religious freedom, conscience, and the independence of the Church's spiritual mission in society. **Be A Saint in the Making!**

SAFE ENVIRONMENT AND COMPLIANCE AUDIT

The Diocese of Toledo is in compliance with the articles of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Charter)* of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Every year, the Diocese dutifully submits the necessary documentation required by the USCCB for a diocese to be in compliance.

Every three years an on-site audit is conducted, when not only all necessary documentation is dutifully submitted, but in addition, Pastoral Center, parish and diocesan school employees are interviewed, concerning practices and protocols related to creating and maintaining a safe environment for our children and youth.

The last 3-year audit was conducted in September 2024 and all audited Articles within the *Charter* were found to be compliant. The next on-site audit will be conducted in 2027.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric, or any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (419) 214-4880 or by mail at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue, Toledo, Ohio 43604.

Dear Parish and School Community,

If you pay Ohio State income taxes, you have a wonderful opportunity to choose where a portion of those dollars goes. 

The state tax credit is limited to \$750 for an individual taxpayer or \$1500 for married couples filing jointly. The tax credit cannot exceed the Ohio tax owed.
