

Go Make a Difference...

There is a famous song that speaks of how we need to be the ones that make a difference. *Go make a difference... Go make a difference in the world...*

There was an ancient philosopher who was shipwrecked and all his earthly possessions sank into the sea, but he managed to reach the shore safely. The local people, out of respect and sadness for him, and his great knowledge, presented him with gifts to make up for his losses. Deeply moved the philosopher wrote: "*Do not lay-up wealth that swollen seas can swallow. Labor only for knowledge, the indestructible good, which not even a shipwreck can take away.*"

It's not about the many possessions that may be taken away from us, but if we live a life in Jesus Christ, we can never lose our most precious treasures, because we possess them deep within, being a *Saint in the Making*. An insightful person observes that only when we don't have anything, do we realize that God is everything. Take care! Be on guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions. We are cautioned that our heart will always be where our riches are. It is Light that ties and Binds together today's scripture readings.

Yes, we can be the salt and light for one another in our troubled world. We are the instruments of Making the World a Better Place. Bringing goodness and helping to stomp out what is evil. Jesus often chose common subjects to demonstrate His teachings. Salt was so important and valuable that Roman soldiers sometimes were paid in salt. Hence the expression, *He's not worth his salt*. Salt on its own is used for clearing roads, a lot of use for that right now, wouldn't you say. But also, for preserving food, and enhances the taste of everything it's added to. It's ironic that adding salt to something sweet enhances the flavor.

Jesus taught His followers to be careful not to lose the flavor of their Creator. These scripture texts today are the conclusion of the Beatitudes, Jesus proclaimed blessings over those who are persecuted, not only for living in the sake of righteousness but for living for *Him*. He described His followers, and believers today, as *salt and light*, clearly called to influence, improve and make the world a better place. Yes, go make a difference! – Fr. Jerry



PRAYER - FASTING - ALMS GIVING

Fasting and prayer can be meaningful spiritual practices for children, and teaching them about these disciplines can help them grow in their faith and relationship with God. As we prepare to begin this Lenten Season we need to spend time helping our children realize the importance of our Lenten practices.

We have to look at spiritual disciplines as a way of helping kids and teens develop habits that will help their spiritual growth and health. These are practices done by Jesus, the Apostles and early Christians. Perhaps the discipline most common in antiquity and least practiced today is fasting for spiritual reasons. By the time of Jesus, fasting had several purposes. People might fast while in mourning, in the face of a local or national tragedy, to prepare for something important or as part of repentance or in service to God.

Although we think of fasting mainly in terms of not being able to eat, it really had greater significance. Fasting was used as a time to stop a daily routine and use that time to reflect and connect with God through prayer. It also provided time to linger in those prayers and "listen" to what God might want the person to know. Finally, it was used as a time of introspection and repentance.

Our idea fasting is often about... what do I give up for Lent? Yes, I give up candy, soda pop, or ice cream... you know these as the children's favorites.

Sometimes though... we need to help them see fasting as like giving of one's time. A great idea for helping one to do something of a change. Like, mom I would love to do the dishes or take out the trash for you. Have the children think about it more seriously this Lent.


