

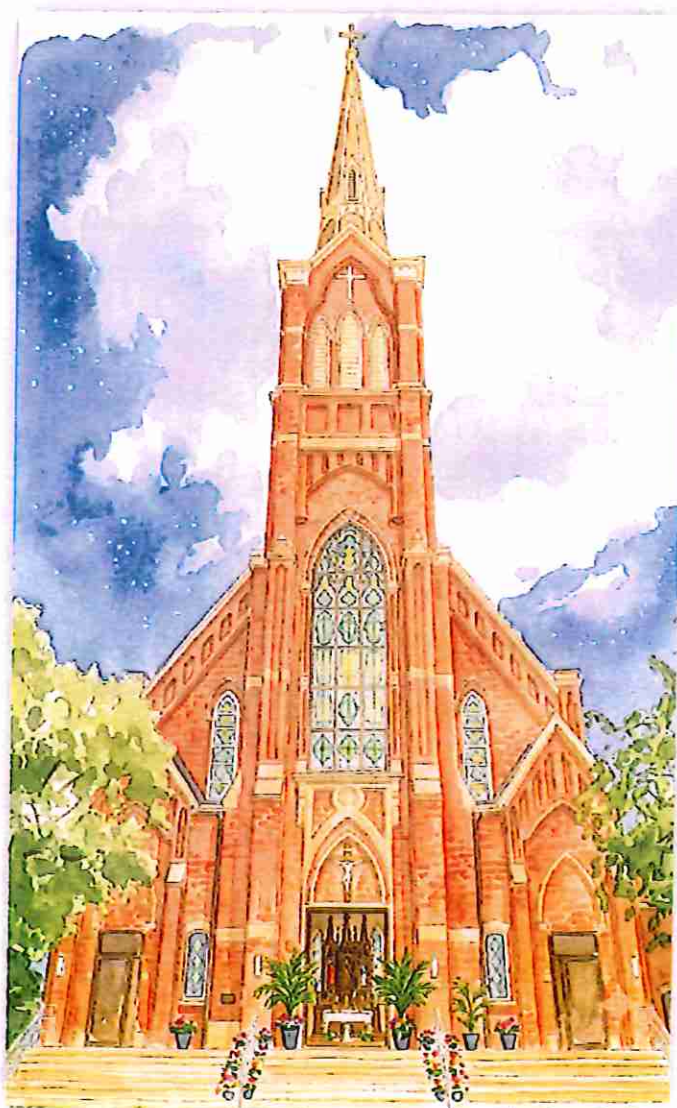

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MIKE

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

My Dear Friends in Christ:



The Gospel depiction of Jesus multiplying the loaves and fishes to feed the 5,000 is a miraculous, incredible, and historical occurrence. This miracle is recorded in all four Gospels, and is what the Church refers to as: “a prefiguring of the Holy Eucharist”. In other words, the feeding of the 5,000 points us to the Last Supper where Jesus gives the Apostles and the world his Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist, and also points us to the celebration of the Holy Mass and the incredible gift we gather to receive week after week.

If you know of someone who many have become disconnected with the Church or fallen away from their faith, or perhaps if you know someone who may have been “lost in the shuffle” or “fallen through the cracks” over the past few years, or if you have family members who no longer practice their beautiful gift of faith as they should – compassionately invite them back to Mass – and offer to come with them! There is nothing more powerful and grace-filled then to have a community of believers – a full church worshipping the Lord and receiving the Holy Sacrament.

In the weeks ahead we will begin planning for another **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)** – the process by which others you are interested in the Catholic faith can learn more and begin the journey to share in this great gift. Consider encouraging family members, coworkers, neighbors, and friends to discover the Catholic faith.

At this Holy Mass, as we are fed with the Holy Eucharist - true bread from heaven, may God give us the simply and sacrificial love to look beyond our own sufferings and see the face of our Savior in the faces of others. And may God inspire our hearts to tell the good news of Jesus Christ. By our words and example, may we be instruments of healing as we strive to lead others to Christ.
