FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MIKE

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

My Dear Friends in Christ:



We have a very unusual Gospel passage this Sunday. A Canaanite woman repeatedly begs Jesus to help her ill daughter. And the response by Jesus at first seems harsh, but our Lord is making a point: the gift of faith is open to all who seek the Lord with a sincere heart. Sometimes we tend to believe that faith is open only to a few—a select group – but our Jesus reminds us that faith is a gift open to all. It isn't unusual for us to judge others and make assumptions that because they look or talk or act a certain way, they could never be a person of faith. Jesus came to call all people to the gift of faith.

I think of the beginning words of the Prayer of Absolution that the priest prays during the Sacrament of Reconciliation: *"God the Father of Mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son, has reconciled the world to himself..."* So, the sacrifice of Jesus was not for just a few, but for the world! In the Gospel passage, Jesus eventually acknowledges the Canaanite's woman's persistence as a great act of faith and exclaims to her *"Woman how great is your faith!"* and we begin to see that Jesus was prompting her all along, to open her heart to the gift of faith.

As summer vacation draws to a close and another school year begins, I ask you to pray for the youth of our parish, of all ages. Catholic education continues to be an important commitment for our parish community. As a priest, I feel honored and privileged to be a part of our children's lives and I cannot wait for school to start! Mrs. Ginny Minnick and our entire School Staff is enthusiastically awaiting the arrival of our students!

Indeed, this ministry takes a great deal of sacrifice from the entire parish community. But first and foremost, parents must be good Christian models and examples to their children. I commend those parents who make the sacrifices necessary to give their children the gift of a Catholic Education – whether in our Parish Elementary School or our Religious Education Program. Let us pray that our efforts allow our children to keep their eyes intently fixed on Jesus Christ!

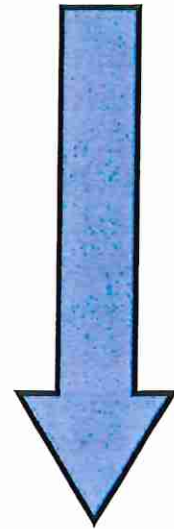

Saint Vincent de Paul is in need of volunteers: 1) to commit to helping with the food pantry. Pantry hours are the first two Tuesdays of the month 1 - 3pm and 7 - 8pm and the third Tuesday 7 - 8pm. 2) to help with the Saint Vincent de Paul help phone.
